

In tandem with the infrastructure comes the issue of inclusion of PwD in higher education and the need to draw out more such women to public spaces. A need-blind admission policy was introduced which attracted potential learners from marginalized sections including the PwD. Full and partial fee waivers were granted on the spot as per need assessment, if the candidate was otherwise eligible, and she did not have to wait in anxiety for admission. The College went beyond the fixed quota of Hostel seats to accommodate the PwD. The VH students were shifted to a section of the Hostel where their rapid evacuation could be ensured in case of natural disasters.

The College Annual Magazine is also released in Braille and now on a CD for VH members. Sports and Cultural festivals are organized by the College in which students with disabilities from all over the University participate. Student cultural programs in the College have integrated the differently-abled across a process of accommodation, participation and inclusion.

The College has appointed staff with disability in both teaching and non-teaching, in its policy of inclusion and also as required by the government. It maintains a PH Roster in both categories which is publicly displayed.
