


## The Gandhi Study Circle

The Gandhi Study Circle is engaged in the organization of a series of events from January-December 2015 as part of the commemoration of the centenary of the return of Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi to India (1915-2015), and the beginning of his life in India. As part of this series, the Gandhi Study Circle in an attempt to engage students with Gandhi across disciplines, organized commemorative lectures in the months of January, February and April. In January, the historian and author Dilip Simeon spoke on "The Music of Humanity: Why Gandhi Still Matters".
