PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

Distinguished Chief Guest Honorable Vice President of Bharat, Shri Jagdeep Dhankar Ji, Respected Vice Chancellor of University of Delhi, Prof. Yogesh Singh Ji, Esteemed Chairman of Governing Body, Shri Alok Shriram Ji, Members of the Governing Body, colleagues, friends and dear students, I take this opportunity to convey my warmest greetings to you and welcome you with sheer pride to the Centennial College Day of Indraprastha College for Women. Allow me to express my gratitude for your presence, as uttering these words fills me with unparalleled prestige. I extend heartfelt thanks to each of you for being here and contributing to this momentous celebration.

Today, Indraprastha College not only celebrates its 100 years of establishment but, more significantly, commemorates a century dedicated to empowering young women through education. This milestone signifies a hundred years of instilling patriotism in its students, inspiring a commitment to courage. Moreover, it represents a century of fostering confidence, independence, and consciousness among its charismatic students, who have excelled in various facets of life. I invite you once again to be a proud testimony to the glorious legacy of the eminence at Indraprastha College as it commemorates its centennial!

We are honored to have among us the Honourable Vice President of Bharat, Shri Jagdeep Dhankar Ji. He is a life member of the Indian Law Institute, the Indian Council of Arbitration, the ICC Commission of Arbitration, and the ICC Court of Arbitration. A sports aficionado, Shri Dhankar ji has been the President of the Rajasthan Olympic Association and the Rajasthan Tennis Association. Sir, I must say that you are an asset to this nation, and we feel extremely privileged to have you with us today!

We are proud to have among us Prof. Yogesh Singh, the Honorable Vice Chancellor of the University of Delhi. Prof. Singh assumed the prestigious charge of being the 23rd Vice-Chancellor of University of Delhi on 8th October 2021. Prior to this, Prof. Singh served as the third Vice Chancellor of Delhi Technological University. I am delighted to share that Sir became Professor of Computer Engineering at the age of 35 in the University School of Information and Communication Technology, Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi. He held many administrative responsibilities like Dean, University School of Engineering & Technology (2001-06), Dean, University School of Information and Communication Technology (2001-06), Director, Student Welfare (2006-09), and Controller of Examinations (2006-11) of Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Delhi. Sir became the 16th Vice Chancellor of The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda, Gujarat, at the age of 45 years. Prof. Singh is an academician par excellence, a decisive leader with the courage to dream big and bring change, a beloved educationist who has touched the lives of innumerable number of students as well as his colleagues and peers. Thank you for being with us today!

I am thankful to the contributions of innumerable alumnae of Indraprastha College who have woven its history. These women have been architects of change, shaping the narrative of the institution through their remarkable achievements. From groundbreaking strides in academia to impactful roles in diverse professions, the alumni stand as living embodiments of Indraprastha College for Women's commitment to excellence and women's empowerment. Their accomplishments underscore the enduring legacy and transformative impact of Indraprastha College on generations of successful individuals, turning its history into a dynamic chronicle of empowerment and triumph.

Reflecting upon the Centennial Celebrations of the College, I am extremely delighted to share that we have successfully completed the mammoth task of permanent faculty recruitment. 123 faculty members have been recruited at Indraprastha College for Women. I sincerely thank the Ministry of Education, Government of India, University Grants Commission (UGC), Honourable Vice Chancellor, the Dean of Colleges, the Chairman and the members of the Governing Body, subject matter experts and all personnel who tirelessly contributed their efforts in realizing this process.

The College has hosted an array of diverse academic and extracurricular activities. The College embarked on its centennial journey, commencing with the empowering event 'ASTITVA' on

March 15, 2023. This celebration of International Women's Day featured **Lieutenant Colonel Renuka Harne**, Vishishth Sewa Medal (VSM), inspiring students to explore careers in *Bharatiya Sena*. On 20 March 2023, the college hosted a delegation of fourteen USIEF scholars, including Fulbright-Nehru International Education Administrators and seminar participants. The visit featured presentations on the college's glorious history and international collaborations, student-led programs, and a campus tour. An engaging interaction with faculty explored opportunities for collaborative research, concluding with a gracious lunch hosted by the Principal, Prof Poonam Kumria. On the occasion of World Water Day, a discussion titled 'Sixth Colloquy: Ganga Samvad' sponsored by National Mission for Clean Ganga, Ministry of Jal Shakti was organized by Indian Institute of Public Administration, New Delhi in college premises. The Annual Cultural Festival of College- *Shruti* saw a grand inaugural with Masterclass by **Ms. Navika Kumar**, Editor-in-Chief, Times Now on March 27. On May 16, during the Indo-Slovenia Intellectual Dialogue 2023, a Certificate of Appreciation was awarded by the Honourable Ambassador of Slovenia, **Ms. Mateja Vodeb Ghosh** to the Principal, Indraprastha College for her remarkable contributions in the field of Higher Education. Continuing this legacy, the college received the 'National Education and Awareness Award' on World Environment Day, June 5. The date marked yet another milestone; Indraprastha College participated as a Nodal Office in an online training programme conducted by Indian Institute of Remote Sensing, ISRO Dehradun from June 5 to June 9.

Honoring the 'Har Ghar Dhyaan' initiative by Honourable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi ji, a session on Meditation was conducted on June 23 by renowned public speaker **Ms. Lalima Aneja Dang** from Art of Living. Respecting and endorsing the concept of '*Swachh Bharat*', a Waste Segregation Drive was organized in the college campus on July 3 in collaboration with the United Nations Environment Program. The 77th Independence Day of Bharat was celebrated with great pomp and show on 15th August in the college premises with enthusiastic participation of teaching and non-teaching staff. The day also marked the inauguration of the Kite Flying Workshop organized under *Meri Mati Mera Desh* from 16-22 August. This year's Raksha Bandhan celebration was special for Indraprastha College as a team of 30 students and faculty members celebrated the joyful festival with **Agniveers** of the **Rajputana Rifles** regiment stationed in Delhi Cantonment.

A Kathak recital was held in collaboration with Zonal Office (North), Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) by **Ms. Nilakshi Khandkar** on August 31. The college witnessed enlightening sessions including seminars and workshops on September 4th and 5th, 2023, that delved into the realms of ‘Vedic Mathematics’, Indian Heroes of World War I, Panini’s Ashtadhyayi, and the empowerment of Bharatiya women. Eminent speakers such as **Shri Ravi Kumar Iyer, Dr. Chivukula Sree Rama Prabhu,** and **Dr. Vasudha Gupta** captivated students, radiating the cultural richness of Bharat. Following the success of this event a **Centre of Vedic Mathematics was established in the College.**

Subsequent events encompassed a ‘Digital Awareness Program’ conducted on September 12, highlighting secure money transfers and precautions against digital fraud. The ‘Bhartiya Army Calling’ session held on September 15 by **Lt. Col. (Dr.) Rajan Gupta** emphasized women’s integral role in the military, addressing recruitment pathways and increased opportunities. ‘Intellectual Property Rights’ discussions on trademarks, industrial design, and copyright unfolded on September 20, by **Prof. Pushpa Kumar**, emphasizing the societal balance in creativity protection. **Shri Vishwa Vijayendra Prasad**, Member of Parliament, graced the college concurrently for unraveling ‘The Art of Storytelling in Bharatiya Cinema.’

A nationwide event, **Ek Tareekh Ek Ghanta-Swachhta hi Sewa** was conceived by the College in its true sense. A dedicated team of 60 students and 50 faculty members along with the Principal of the College visited Khyber Pass area to devote community service by engaging in cleanliness drive and awareness campaign for its residents.

The curtain raiser event for the Start-up Conclave, in collaboration with Udhmodya Foundation, Career Development Center, Samarth Bharat was organized on October 9. **Dr. Abhishek Tondon**, Joint CEO, Udhmodya Foundation along with **Shri Bharat Bhushan Arora**, Member-Samarth Bharat and Director, Udhmodya Foundation were the Chief Guest for the event where they announced the Start-up Accelerator Program (SAP). The event witnessed more than 500 participants with students and faculty members from various colleges. On October 16, *Amrit Kalash Yatra* paid homage to soil conservation and national heroes, featuring **Shri Manoj Tiwari**, Member of Parliament. The event filled students with utmost joy and enthusiasm for patriotic values, emanating from ‘*Meri Maati, Mera Desh*’. September 27 marked a very important event for Indraprastha College, with the revamping of NCC. To commemorate this, an interactive session

was organized with the presence of **Major General Sanjai Vishwasrao**, ADG, NCC, Delhi on October 17 in the College premises.

A discussion on *Developed India Mission- 1947 to 2047* was coordinated by eminent personalities like **Mr. Ashar Sayeed** from RedHat, USA and **Mr. Udaya Raghunath Birje** from ThinkStreet Technologies on 25th October, 2023. 'Aikyam,' on October 31, celebrated National Unity Day, showcasing Bharat's cultural diversity through various activities. Our esteemed guest, **Shri Vijay Goel** ji delivered a talk on the topic '*Khadi Pe Charcha*', and participated in 'Run for Unity' organized in the College premises. Additionally, the college paid tribute to Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel on his birth anniversary at Samvidhan Sadan, Parliament of India with students and faculty members being gracefully invited to the event.

The 'G-20 Academia-Cultural Indulgence: 50 Years of South Korea-Bharat Friendship' from November 7-8 2023, was a grand success, featuring a photo exhibition, Panel Discussion, K-Pop Dance Competition, and Indo-Korean Food Festival. The collaborative effort with the Culture Council, University of Delhi, in association with partner country South Korea, highlighted 50 years of shared cordiality. In this regard, the College proudly received a token of appreciation from Honourable Vice Chancellor, **Prof Yogesh Singh**.

Closing the year, the 'Open Mic' on Sexual Harassment Prevention Act on December 12, 2023, underscored the institution's commitment to a safe environment. This kaleidoscopic journey, blending academia, culture, and social consciousness, reflects the college's commitment to holistic education, celebrating a century of excellence.

Indraprastha College's 100 years coincide with initiation of 'Viksit Bharat@2047: Voice of Youth' Campaign. The College has successfully initiated programs in this regard with a focus on student mobilization and participation. The College believes to progress in the same direction that is shown by the ideals of Bharat as '**Vishwa-Guru**' and complies in spirit with the philosophy of '*Vasudhaiv Kutumbkam*'.

In order to enhance educational partnerships and explore new spheres in the field of academics, Indraprastha College has successfully signed **Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)** with three **Kenyan Universities**, namely, Maasai Mara University, Kenyatta University and University of Nairobi. I am delighted to share that Indraprastha College has proudly entered into an alliance with

Nature Positive Universities. Latter is an initiative of the **UN Environment Programme (UNEP)** and the **University of Oxford**. Indraprastha College has succeeded in facilitating the maximum number of students compared to any other College in University of Delhi. The College has currently registered **653** students with Nature Positive University.

In continuation of our journey towards achieving academic excellence, this year more than 75 faculty members have contributed to the field of academic writing. Nine faculty members have authored and edited books, 18 have contributed book chapters and 68 have published research papers. Five faculty members have collaborated on projects with various National and International agencies such as ICSSR and JETREG. 50 faculty members have presented their innovative research findings at National and International platforms. Similarly, 50 faculty members have shared their expertise in various Conferences and Seminars as Resource Persons in various capacities. In order to keep abreast with the innovations in academia, more than 60 faculty members successfully completed Faculty Development and Induction programs (FDPs and FIPs) and Refresher Courses. Abiding by the interventions of the New National Education Policy, 2020, 24 faculty members contributed in the Curriculum Development and Revision. I congratulate three of our faculty members who have been accorded with the professorship. I also extend my heartfelt congratulations to nine faculty members who have been conferred with Doctoral Degrees in the year 2023.

The students of IPCW continue to bring honor to the college by consistently achieving accolades and distinctions. Their dedication to excellence reflects positively on the institution and establishes a legacy of success and pride within the academic community. To present some facts on the achievements of students at Indraprastha College, I'm pleased to share that more than 70 publications in the form of research articles, poems, and newspaper articles have been produced by our under-graduate students. 40 students have participated and contributed at the University level initiatives such as debates, symposia, quiz, literary and cultural festivals. Ten students received various awards and recognitions other than College positions. At various State and National level competitions, 15 students bagged top positions. 12 students gracefully represented the College at the International front. To mention a few, Ms. Rhea Sinha (BA Hons. Psychology) bagged a Gold Medal in 3rd North India Zone Karate Championship held in November, 2023. Keeping the zeal for creative thinking at par with physical development, Gold was secured by Ms.

Arushi Kotwal (BA Hons. Political Science) in J&K UT Women Chess Championship. Continuing the spirit for Sports and actualizing 'Fit India' mission, yet another gold was acquired by Ms. Ananya Pandey (BA Hons. Philosophy) in Chhattisgarh State Close Championship held in August 2023. Securing First position in Under 19 Badminton State Championship, Ms. Ranya Rana (BA Hons Political Science) brought laurels to us. Celebrating the roots of Bhartiyata, I'm proud to announce that our student, Ms. Prachi Tiwari (BA Hons. Sanskrit) secured 1st position in the Sanskrit Olympiad organized by Delhi Government. College's NSS wing is one of the flagship endeavors in developing the sentiment for Community Service. To endorse this, I want to share that Ms. Kashika Bajaj (BA Hons Sociology) represented the Delhi Contingent along with 17 other students, at a 12 Day Camp in MMPG College, Fatehabad, Haryana. Establishing a strong mark on international frontiers, Ms. Shivani Raj (BA Hons Political Science) received the certificate of Best Delegate at Becon Academy, Indonesia. I'm proud to share that one of our students with Visual Impairment (VI) doing BA(Hons) Music, Ms. Sapna Ahirwar, is the only girl student of Delhi University doing her specialization in Tabla playing.

In the year 2023, our college has embraced a diverse student body, enrolling 1416 undergraduates and 123 candidates, including 12 talented individuals from eight different countries. Reflecting our commitment to social responsibility, we have extended Full Fee waivers to 90 students, with an additional 400 benefiting from Partial Fee Waivers. Providing a nurturing environment, the College offers residential accommodations in two hostels, where 14 students receive Partial Fee waivers. Upholding inclusivity, we've granted Full Fee Waivers to 80 students with disabilities (PwBD) and Partial Waivers for Hostel Fees to 18 students with disabilities. Gratefully acknowledging external support, the College has received financial assistance for 249 students from various organizations.

To mark the 100th Anniversary of this esteemed institution, we are releasing a series of literary masterpieces along with our reputed Annual Magazine, *Aaroh*. *Aaroh*, whose essence mirrors the towering majesty of mountains, gracefully and poignantly captures the profound sentiments resonating within the hearts of Indraprastha College's students. The edition of *Aaroh-2023* aptly titled 'Spectrum of Dreams: from *Amrit Kaal* to *Kartavya Kaal*,' encapsulates the sentiments of Indraprastha College. As we flip through its pages, we embark on a journey through time, delving into a century's worth of intellect and creativity.

DEPARTMENT ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

Commerce

The Academic Society of the Department of Commerce had a fruitful tenure marked by several notable initiatives and events. The year started with a Treasure Hunt Competition - The Millet Searchers on February 1, 2023, emphasizing and celebrating the International Year of the Millets. The event was held in two rounds, a quiz round and the treasure hunt round. A total of 100 students participated in the preliminary round.

On 25th April 2023, the society conducted its annual fest 'BIZFIESTA'. The event consisted of a series of intra-college competitions, namely Shipwreck: Business Simulation competition, Managers' Bizz: Case Study competition and Fund from Junk: Product launch campaign.

In light of the celebration of "Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav" a Webinar 'Yoga for Success' was organized on 8th August, 2023, on the theme Health and Wellness. Headed by volunteers from Isha Foundation, a non-profit, spiritual organization founded by Sadhguru, the program included Yog Namaskar, chanting of AUM and yoga for strengthening the spine.

Orientation Program was conducted for the new batch on 16th August in the seminar room to welcome the first-year students to college. A workshop on 'Case studies and Guesstimates' was organized on 18th October, 2023 headed by Mr. Amit Poddar, the Senior Regional Head of T.I.M.E. The event was attended by about 150 students. Mr. Poddar shared valuable insights with the students, encouraging them to think creatively. The event turned out to be a huge success as students got an opportunity to explore new areas and expand their horizons of knowledge and logical thinking.

The department organized an interactive sessions on 'Mutual Fund & SIP' by Mr. Har Govind Sachdev (ex-GM State Bank of India, expert in forex and climate risk mitigation in banks) on 26th October, 2023 to teach students about investing, achieving financial objectives, outpace inflation, generate income and to comprehend the risks and returns and create a customized investing strategy based on one's unique requirements and objectives and on 30th October, 'Digital Marketing' by Mr. Akash Gogri, Senior Manager, Indian Institute of Digital Education. Students learned about various digital marketing tools and techniques, including search engine optimization (SEO), content marketing, and social media marketing.

An industrial visit to National Small Industries Corporation (NSIC), Okhla on 5th December 2023 was arranged and 73 students from the final year along with 4 faculty members went for the visit. The visit offered firsthand insight into the practical applications of theoretical knowledge gained in the classrooms and also highlighted the intricacies of the industrial processes, equipping students with the knowledge that extends beyond textbooks and classrooms.

Computer Science

The department of computer science conducted a seminar on "Digital Transformation and Artificial Intelligence: Opportunities and Challenges," on 15 February 2023. Dr Sachin Kumar, Assistant Professor at Cluster Innovation Centre, University of Delhi was the speaker.

A webinar on “Ayurveda: A Philosophy of Complete Health” was organized on 8 August 2023 at 12:00 pm onwards was organized under the aegis of IQAC and Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav.

On 25 October 2023 a National Seminar on “Best Practices for Testing and Validating Machine Learning Deployments” was organized. The speaker was Dr. Tilottama Goswami, an esteemed Professor in the Department of Information and Technology, Vasavi College of Engineering.

Besides, on the same day a discussion on “Artificial Intelligence and Innovation Driving New India’s Techade” was organized. The event was graced by the presence of Mr. Azhar Sayeed, Global Chief Technologist, RedHat U.S.A and Mr. Uday Raghunath Birje, Co-Founder and Director – Think Street Technologies.

Environmental Studies

The Department of Environmental Studies, Indraprastha College for Women creates a platform for students to learn and practice environmental protection beyond their prescribed curriculum. With a focus on practical experience, the department promotes sustainability practices within the college, hosts environmental events, and advocates for positive change. In the year 2023, the department continued with its commitment to organize lectures, workshops, nature trails and events on relevant environmental issues.

On 2nd February 2023 students enthusiastically attended the World Wetland Day celebration at Yamuna Biodiversity Park. Attendees engaged in insightful discussions, learning about the significance of preserving wetland ecosystems. Guided tours offered a firsthand experience of the

diverse flora and fauna in the Yamuna Biodiversity Park, emphasizing the role of wetlands in maintaining biodiversity.

A Campus Bird Count was conducted in the College on 17 February 2023. This bird count was a part of the Global Backyard Bird Count (GBBC), a global bird monitoring event organized annually by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and National Audubon Society, USA. In total 29 species of birds were sighted and recorded from the campus during this count.

The Department of Environmental Studies in collaboration with the Department of Geography and the National Service Scheme unit of the College observed the World Environment Day on 5th June 2023. Several events like the Reel-making competition and Environmental Literacy Quiz were organized involving the College community to generate environmental awareness and urge the youth to take part in Life Style for Environment, an initiative launched by the Prime Minister of India. A keynote address was delivered by the Principal, Prof. Poonam Kumria, followed by a talk on 'Plastic Pollution' by Prof. Vandana Mishra, Department of Environmental Studies, University of Delhi. Students and faculty of the College attended the online meeting of the Ministry of Education and took the 'Mission LiFe Pledge' together.

In an interactive session organized by the department on 'Community-based Conservation' on 26th September 2023, renowned Indian conservation biologist and wildlife activist, Dr. Purnima Devi Barman, delivered a captivating talk, weaving her passion for biodiversity conservation with tales of her impactful initiatives in Assam. Focused on the preservation of endangered species like the Greater Adjutant Stork, she shared insights into community-driven conservation models. Her engaging narratives showcased the power of grassroots efforts and ignited inspiration among the students to contribute actively to conservation.

The Department of Environmental Studies organized an awareness program on Air pollution on 6th October 2023 in collaboration with the National Museum of Natural History (NMNH) and Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change (MoEFCC), Govt. of India. The keynote speaker of the event was Dr. C. R. Mahesh, Scientist-C, from the National Museum of Natural History (NMNH). His impactful speech included a video on Earth's beauty and pollution threat, featuring Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Mission LiFe. An interactive session delved into Delhi's vehicular pollution and steps for control, followed by a Q&A session. Around 650 students took a pledge to control Air pollution in Delhi and to keep our environment clean as a part of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. An enthralling Nukkad Natak on awareness about Air pollution was

performed by the students of 'Abhivyakti' the dramatics society of Indraprastha College for Women.

History

On the 3rd of November 2023, the Department of History of Indraprastha College for Women hosted an enlightening lecture at 11:30 AM in the Conference Room which was graced by the brief presence of the Principal, Professor Poonam Kumria.

The lecture, titled "Remembering Rani Gaidinliu: A Forgotten Freedom Fighter of Indian Freedom Movement," aimed to honour the remarkable legacy of Rani Gaidinliu, an unsung hero of Indian freedom movement and making the present generation aware about the contribution of forgotten freedom fighters. Dr. Nilanjan De, an Assistant Professor in Rabindrasadan Girls' College, Karimganj, Assam, served as the distinguished resource person, sharing his wealth of knowledge in Indian history.

Following the lecture, a spirited question and answer session engaged students actively, inspiring them to celebrate their own culture and traditions rather than adopting foreign ones. The event emphasized the importance of recalling forgotten heroes like Rani Gaidinliu, leaving an indelible impact on both students and faculty, kindling a newfound sense of cultural pride and heritage.

Multi Media and Mass Communication

In the year 2023, the Department of Multi Media and Mass Communication (MMMC) undertook a diverse array of activities. The year started with a seminar on Copyright Law and Infringement on January 7, 2023, with Mr. Luv Virmani and Ms. Aadya Chawla as guest speakers, both distinguished legal professionals.

A movie screening of the animated film, "Lost Partitions" was organized on January 18, 2023 in collaboration with History and English departments. Produced by Project Dastaan, an organization with origins in Oxford University, the film explores repercussions of the 1947 partition of the Indian subcontinent through three animated episodes.

On January 28, 2023, the department organized a Saturday Workshop conducted by Ms. Itika Singh and Ms. Mitisha Sharma, journalists from a Delhi-based non-profit research institute PRS Legislative Research on 'Parliamentary Reporting'. The primary objective of the workshop was to impart knowledge to aspiring journalists concerning parliamentary reporting.

On February 3rd and 4th, the department orchestrated a Photography Field Visit to Keoladeo National Park in Bharatpur, India, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. It provided students and photographers with a remarkable opportunity to capture diverse landscapes, reflections, and lighting scenarios.

On February 13, on the occasion of the World Radio Day, 2nd-year students attended the ‘The Wave Forward’ Radio Festival at the India International Centre, New Delhi. The event, organized in collaboration with UNESCO, presented students with the chance to engage with notable personalities in the field.

A specialized workshop on Indian textiles was conducted for 3rd-year students on February 25, 2023 led by Ms. Rachna Imam, a specialist in Indian textiles and head of the ‘USTTAD project, shared her expertise, emphasizing the preservation of traditional arts and crafts of minority communities.

On September 11, 2023, the department organized a workshop on ‘International Reportage’ in collaboration with France’s ‘Médias Monde Academy’. Esteemed speakers Charles Wente and François Picard from France 24 enriched students with insights into international reporting.

On September 13, 2023, 3rd-year students participated in the Media Summit of the PHDCCI, focusing on the distinct characteristics of Indian media in a contemporary context.

A visit to the Lalit Kala Akademi, National Academy of Art, Delhi, was orchestrated for 2nd-year students on September 14, 2023. The visit encompassed a gallery walk, a glass upcycling workshop, and a painting demonstration, fostering creative expression and artistic sensibilities.

Collaborating with IQAC and the Google News Initiative, the MMMC department hosted a workshop on ‘Fact-checking and Visual Verification’ on September 22, 2023. Dr. Archana Kumari, an Associate Professor at the Centre for Media Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, served as the speaker, aiming to promote media literacy and vigilance in media consumption among students.

A field trip to Satyagraha Mandap, Rajghat, was organized on October 20, 2023, for a ‘Best Out of Waste Workshop’ conducted by Ms. Nehmat Mongia, a design specialist from the National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad.

Finally, on December 4th and 5th, 2023, second year students visited the Amar Ujala Printing Press in Noida, facilitating practical knowledge and experiential learning in the field of multimedia and mass communication.

Philosophy

The Department of Philosophy successfully organized the following events throughout the academic year 2022-2023.

The first event themed ‘Young Philosophers talk’ (Annual day & Farewell) was organised on 26 April 2023. Student-faculty interaction was the highlight of the event. They shared how philosophy enhanced their problem-solving capacities, analysing concepts and arguments and helped them to improve their communication skills, persuasive powers, and writing skills.

Freshers’ welcome Aarambh was organised on 23 September 2023 for the new batch of first years under the theme “Perfection is an illusion” with the aim of promoting mental and physical positivity and inclusivity in all arenas.

An international seminar organized on 29 November 2023 on the occasion of World Philosophy Day with sponsorship support from ICPR, Delhi under the theme ‘Philosophy of Contemporary Thinkers’. Prof. Hari Shankar Prasad (Chief Guest and Former HOD, Department of Philosophy, University of Delhi), Prof. Evandro Vieira Ouriques (Distinguished Guest and Professor, Communication School, Federal University of Rio de Janeiro and Researcher, Department of Philosophy, Paris), Prof. Estelita -Yoga expert and two students representing from national and international universities sharing a common space for interdisciplinary outlook on the prescribed theme were the distinguished guest of honors. Prof. Hari Shankar Prasad spoke on ‘Indian Philosophy as the Therapy of Mind’. His focus was on self-improvement and how a person can use his/her mind to change their life. He emphasized on the significance of Indian Philosophy in shaping our constitution, rooted in the principles of nature and the cosmos rather than centered on a specific deity. The Second Speaker of the session was Prof. Evandro Vieira Ouriques. He spoke on non-duality as the communicational condition of human beings and the transcultural poetics of west-east counter, by stressing on the significance of non-duality, drawing from real-life instances and making notable references to the works of Western philosophers. After the question-answer session, a poetry collection of famous Indian poet, Ram Dhari Singh ‘Dinkar’ Ji named ‘Krishna Ki Chetavni’ was presented by final year students. Event concluded with a performance by Korean Singer Hyungjin An. Vote of thanks was given by Dr. Paulavi Das, Teacher-in-Charge, Department of Philosophy.

Political Science

The Department of Political Science did a Parliament visit on January 17, 2023 under the coordinated efforts of Parliamentary Research and Training Institute for Democracies (PRIDE) and a study-visit to the Gandhi Smriti Museum, New Delhi, on 28 January 2023 with Gandhi Study Circle, which was very informative and a humble learning experience for all. A Research Methodology Workshop was organized in collaboration with the Center for Writing and Communication (CWC), Ashoka University, on January 31, 2023 in the College Auditorium. Conducted by Dr. Vrinda Chopra and Ms. Vinky Mittal from Center for Writing and Communication (CWC), Ashoka University, students immensely benefitted from this academic exercise.

The students enthusiastically participated in the National Photo Essay Competition, 'AAYAM' organized in early March by the Department for Colleges and Universities across India in March 2023. The Department also organized an International Seminar on Understanding South Asia-Security Challenges: Traditional and Non-Traditional on 21 and 22 March, 2023 sponsored by the Indian Council of Social Research (ICSSR). Over the course of these two-days, five intellectually stimulating sessions were conducted and a cultural evening with folk dancers was organized to mark the conclusion of the seminar. The Department celebrated Ambedkar Jayanti on April 14, 2023, on the occasion of the 132nd Birth Anniversary of Babasaheb Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar. It was an online event and attended by the students and faculty members of the department. The Department organized its Annual Day- *Shakti*, based on the theme of women empowerment on April 25, 2023, which consisted of power packed cultural performances along with a summary of the academic activities held in the session 2022-23. This was followed by bidding adieu to the Batch of 2023.

In June and July 2023 the department had a series of activities with the alumna of the College from the Department of Political Science visiting their alma mater. On June 14, 2023 'Services to the Nation: An Interactive Session' with Alumna Muskan Khurana, UPSC CSE 2022 Air 98 was organized and attended with enthusiasm and pride by all. Under AKAM-Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav, the Department collaborated with various ECA Societies in College and NSS putting forth a series of events running through July and August 2023. These included 'Unveiling Unity' Picture Interpretation Activity based on the Indian National Movement, poster making on the theme of LiFE, Sustainable Development and Us. An online cultural evening titled Geetmala was

organized celebrating music from the various Tribes of India. A webinar (August 12, 2023) was organized on the theme- RIVERS with two speakers Prof. Jyoti Trehan Sharma (Dept of Political Science, IPCW) and Dr. Ruchi Shree (Assistant Professor, PG department of Political Science, Tilka Majhi Bhagalpur University, Bihar).

Celebrating India's G20 Presidency, the Department on October 10, 2023 organized an interactive session, titled 'India and Bangladesh Relations in the context of Indo-Pacific and G20 India Summit' with Prof. Shahidul Haque, the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) Bangabandhu Chair, University of Delhi. The year 2023 concluded with two well-attended events organized in collaboration with the NSS Unit of the College in November, the Calligraphy Competition held for the entire College community to mark the National Constitution Day of India and Voter ID registration Campaign on November 29-30, 2023. The booths set up supported hundreds of students to register for their Voter ID Cards. The Department of Political Science sincerely thanks the Principal, Professor Poonam Kumria for her guidance and support throughout the academic year.

Sociology

Department of Sociology organised a webinar under Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, themed Tribal Empowerment, on the 14th of August, 2023. Dr Avitoli G. Zhimo, Joint Director of Centre for Tribal Studies, University of Delhi and Associate Professor of Anthropology, University of Delhi, was invited to deliver a talk for the event. The event was attended by 55 participants and was held on google meet.

Dr. Avitoli G. Zhimo's talk emphasized on the historical trajectory of the origin and usage of the term "tribes". Drawing from anthropological, sociological and historical sources, she talked about the emergence of different definitions and approaches to explain 'tribes' in the context of India. "Tribes" also known as '*Jana- Jati, Girijan, Vanavasi*' are not homogenous groups. They came to be seen as regional inhabitants who were kept outside the caste system and were marginalized. Dr. Zhimo mentioned that early anthropologists and colonial administrators used derogatory terms such as primitive and barbaric to describe the tribes in India.

A well-accepted term for tribes in contemporary times is '*Adivasi*'. However, she cautioned against using the term as not all communities categorized under Scheduled Tribes identify themselves as '*Adivasi*'. Dr. Zhimo also briefly discussed PVTGs (Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups) and

DNTs (Denotified Tribes). She builds up her arguments from the concept of disempowerment to understand tribal empowerment.

B. A. Program

The Department of B.A. Program organized a lecture, “*The File that is Life,*” by Mr. Amitabh Prasad, Principal Director (International Relations) at the Indian Audit and Accounts Service (IAAS), on 11th January 2023 at the college auditorium.

B.A. Program Reading Club facilitated thought-provoking discussions on the topic ‘Lowering the Limits of Freedom: A Philosophical Perspective’ on 24th January 2023 to learn about various opinions related to freedom as a philosophical concept. The discussion was followed by sharing a series of lectures on Swami Vivekananda following a writing task, in which members had to write their views about Swami Vivekananda’s theories and discuss their views on freedom by substantiating them appropriately.

To commemorate the milestone of 100th College Day, on 6th February, IP Vani conducted ‘A Deux Conversations and Memories’ consisting of short interviews with the students and alumni of the College to know their experiences and share splendid stories of the college. IP Vaani covered the IP LitFest’23 on 23rd February 2023. It also conducted interviews with prominent guest speakers like Padma Shri Malini Awasthi and Ms. Rita Kothari.

The department organized a vibrant Cultural Day celebration *Ekta: A Celebration of Mother Language*, on 6th March 2023 to celebrate the occasion of International Mother Language Day. Students from diverse backgrounds came together to showcase their rich heritage through captivating performances showcasing traditional music and dance, poetry and prose recitations. This event celebrated our students’ diverse cultural backgrounds and also promoted cross-cultural understanding and inclusivity within the academic community.

Besides these, the Department has actively participated in G20 empower Conclave (Empowerment and Progression of Women’s Economic Representation) on 3rd February 2023, “Har Ghar Dhyam: Meditation and Mental Health” on 6th March 2023, Fulbright-Nehru International Education Administrators to Indraprastha College for Women on 20th March 2023 and ‘*Seva Parmoh Dharma*’: C20 Chaupal on 23rd March 2023 organized by the University of Delhi.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

Career Counseling and Placement Committee of Indraprastha College for Women hosted numerous events, workshops, and seminars throughout the year, to equip the students with the necessary skills and to help them make informed decisions as they embark on their journey to enter the professional world and prepare to opt for higher education opportunities.

The Year 2023 started off with a seminar on ‘Career Trends in India’ by Ms. Pervin Malhotra, a well-known career counselor with decades of experience in career guidance and counseling, on 15 January 2023. It was followed by another intuitive and insightful seminar on ‘Careers in Management and its various aspects’ by the SP Jain Institute of Management and Research on 30th January, 2023.

A Global University Fair 2023 was organized on 15th February, 2023 in collaboration with ICAE India. With over 500+ student registrations, the event comprised multiple Universities from different parts of the world for enlightening the students about Higher Education prospects in top National and International Universities.

The Career Counseling and Placement Committee organized a “Special Lecture Series” from January to March 2023. The series began with a special lecture on careers and entrepreneurship on 13th January, 2023 by Ms. Archana Garodia Gupta, an esteemed woman entrepreneur who inspired the students to work towards turning their dreams into reality and persistently follow their goals, hobbies, and talents. Following this, a lecture on ‘Careers in Law’ was organized on 11th February, 2023 by prominent lawyers Ms. Bahuli Sharma, Mr. Shivam Singh, and Mr. Rachit Ranjan who shared their experiences about law as a profession highlighting the boundless opportunities it offers for career growth and advancements. The last event in the series was conducted by Mr. Jayanta Saha, Senior Regional Head at T.I.M.E. Institute on 21st March, 2023 on the topic ‘Careers in Government Sectors’.

A two day ‘Placement Preparation Bootcamp’ was organized from 8-10 August 2023. Total 150 students participated in the boot camp. A Webinar on ‘Audit & Analytics’ was organized on 18 August 2023. A total of 102 participants attended the webinar.

A workshop on 'Career Prospects at RBI of India' was organized in the college on 7th December 2023 by Ms. Anshvey Kaintura (Head of Budget, Audit and Coordination Cell in HRMD) and Mr. Yogendra Kumar (Head of HR Development & Training Cell in HRMD) from RBI.

Placement Results:

From January to August, a total of 30 placement drives were conducted for the students. 42 students received offer letters from prominent companies like Posist Technologies, Kline and Company, JLL Business Services, Godrej Properties, MGH Group, Hike Education, Planify, Barclays, Crowe, EXL, etc.

From January to December 2023, a total of 60 companies visited the campus offering a plethora of opportunities to the students of Indraprastha College for Women. A total of 123 offer letters were received during this fruitful year.

The new session began in August 2023. From August- December 2023, 18 placement drives were conducted for the students of Indraprastha College for Women. Total 81 students received Offer Letters from Deloitte, KPMG, D.E. Shaw, Future First, RSA Group, Wise FinServ, WTW, SAP Labs, SSSI, EY Global Delivery Services, Barclays Bank, Siya Consulting, Verizon etc. Average CTC was 6.87 LPA and the highest package being 23.05 LPA was offered by 'D.E. Shaw & Co' to Ms. Mahi Vohra, student of Economics (Hons) and Ridhima Ahuja, student of B. Com (Hons).

The CGP Cell floated prestigious case study competitions such as HSBC India Business Case Program, Bain & Company's BRAINWARS and Deloitte's Graduate School Maverick Season 7 to help students gain exposure to real world experiences, network with industry professionals and enhance their presentation skills. A team of four students: Muskan Singh, Ananya Talwar, Divyanshi Tyagi and Manshi Golchha, all from B.Com.(H) second year made it to the semi-finale round.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL

ENABLING UNIT

The Indraprastha College for Women has instituted the Enabling Unit to cater to the students with special needs. The College has admitted a total of 22 students with disabilities in the academic year 2023-24. During the academic year 2023-2024, a total number of 38 students with visual impairments were selected for a scholarship offered by 'Help the Blind Foundation', a Non-Governmental Organization.

The Enabling Unit organized various events during the January-December 2023. The year commenced with 'Samarthya' Annual Inter-college Fest 2023 for students with disabilities on 1 February 2023. The Samarthya Fest was inaugurated by the Principal, Prof. Poonam Kumria. The chief guest Prof. Kusumlata Malik, a Professor from Department of Hindi, University of Delhi, was invited to deliver an enlightening talk on 'Literature, Disability and Society: A Dialogue'. As a part of Samarthya Fest 2023, the Enabling Unit conducted three inter-college competitions: Extempore Competition, Singing Competition and Play Competition. More than 100 students with disabilities from various colleges of the University of Delhi participated and the winners in the said competitions were awarded certificates with cash prizes. In March 2023, the students and faculty members embraced 'yellow attire' to mark the World Down Syndrome Day on 21 March 2023. The participants enthusiastically uploaded photographs on social media. The Enabling Unit organized a Farewell for the batch of 2023 on 28 April 2023. The students of Ist and IInd year undergraduate courses presented cultural performances for their seniors. Principal Prof. Poonam Kumria, Principal, Indraprastha College, distributed certificates to the students who successfully completed the RISE courses in the academic year 2022-2023 and also to those who completed Computer Skills Training Courses in the academic year 2022-2023. To mark the beginning of the new academic year, an Orientation Programme for Freshers was organised on 31 August 2023. The coordinator and members of Enabling Unit introduced themselves, and made a detailed presentation on the accessibility infrastructure, special facilities, and services available for students with disabilities enrolled in the college. As the new session began, a 15-day mobility orientation programme was conducted from 1 September 2023 to 21 September 2023. Mr. Anil Kumar, a certified mobility instructor, trained the students with visual impairment to navigate within and around the college premises. The organization, 'Help the Blind foundation' also distributed Smart Vision Glasses to five students of the college on 26 September 2023. All the recipients were

oriented with the utility and functioning of smart vision glasses. A significant day, The International White Cane Safety Day, was celebrated on 18 October 2023. Ms. Jyoti and Mr. Ashwang from 'Help the Blind Foundation' oriented and created sensitization about the use and relevance of white cane. White Cane Awareness March was held in the college premises with the participation of nearly 200 students and faculty members. Principal Prof. Poonam Kumria was gracious enough to participate in the white cane march. Prof. Kumria also distributed certificates to the volunteers of Maitri Society. The Enabling Unit of Indraprastha College has students with diverse talents. Ms. Sapna Ahirwar, a first-year student of BA (Hons) Music, is the only girl student doing her specialization in 'Tabla' in University of Delhi.

The year 2023 ended with another significant day, The International Day of Persons with Disabilities. It was celebrated on 4 December 2023 in the college. Open Mic Event on “*Zero Tolerance on Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal Act, 2013)*” was organized on 12th December 2023 to provide awareness within the College. The march was also conducted by the students, teachers, and non-teaching staff to promote awareness. The posters for spreading awareness were put in different places, including the notice board of the hostel, library and canteen.

GANDHI STUDY CIRCLE

The Gandhi Study Circle of Indraprastha College for Women has been actively engaged in various events and activities throughout 2023, contributing to cultural enrichment, awareness, and community involvement of the students.

ACADEMIA-CULTURAL INDULGENCE

SCIENCE SOCIETY- ANANTA

Ananta –The Science Society of Indraprastha College for Women, University of Delhi, organized a workshop on Blockchain and Cryptocurrency on 31 January 2023 which focused on secure transactions, reducing compliance costs, and speeding up data transfer processing. Speakers gave the audience a live demonstration of how to sign up for the Bitcoin portal with the help of videos. They talked about the limitations and risks related to cryptocurrency and shared some resources that students can use to counter these risks in an interactive session.

Inquizitors, organized ‘Labour Market’ on 28th January. The session helped students see the relevance of education in their future lives and develop their employability. Inquizitors XXI with the Geography department organized a workshop on the topic ‘Environmental Health’ focusing on a clean environment which is essential for human health and well-being on 24 Feb.

The Society conducted a two-day event as a part of the celebrations for National Science Day on 27 February. This year’s theme, as announced by the Ministry of Science and Technology, was ‘Global Science for Global Well-Being’. Research Paper Presentations was organized on various environment related topics. Participants were given six to seven minutes for presentation and one minute to conclude their research paper and was followed by a Fun Quiz.

On day two, Principal, Prof. Poonam Kumria launched the magazine of Science Society. Prof. Kumria said that science is often considered a separate subject but each subject has science behind it and is present everywhere, in all aspects of our lives.

The theme of the photography competition-Sci-shot competition was- “*Sustainability in Action*”. The participation was high, with entries from various colleges and universities. Various events on environment, conservation, sustainability etc. took place, followed by a discussion forum on the theme - “Technology in Health”.

On 8th April, Inquizitors XXII organized a seminar on ‘psychology of advertisement and brand marketing’ and how branding affects consumer behavior, perception, and decision-making, with B.A. Program Department. It involved understanding the psychological processes that influence how people perceive, evaluate, and choose brands and the development of brand identity and personality.

Several students from various departments worked on Projects and Models, the details of which are listed below:

Kritika Rohilla, Ujjani and Kashish made a Radar System using Arduino and Ultrasonic Sensor which works as an affordable and customizable solution for object detection and distance measurement.

Kritika Rohila developed a 'Morse Code Translator', that allows users to convert text into Morse code signals and decode Morse code back into text.

Simran Vishisht worked on 'Water Level Detection', which aims to develop a reliable water level detection system using Arduino and ultrasonic sensors to address these challenges.

Simran Vishisht developed 'Smart Driving Glasses', which utilize advanced technologies such as sensors, connectivity modules, and alert systems to provide real-time warnings and notifications to drivers minimizing the risk of accidents.

Gauri Saxena developed a smoke detector using sensors, microcontrollers, and alarm mechanisms to ensure prompt detection of smoke and timely evacuation.

Gauri Saxena and Sadgi Tiwari students developed a 'Flame Detecting System', a system that utilizes advanced sensors and algorithms to accurately detect flames to different environments irrespective of flame sizes and intensities and to provide timely alerts for prompt response and mitigation.

Sakshi and Simran Vishisht developed a 'Sound Monitoring System with Clap Detection', that can detect specific sound patterns, such as a clap, and trigger a response, such as illuminating an LED.

Aashima Rathore and Prachi Mishra developed the idea of 'Hydroponic Farming', as an alternative crop cultivation.

Gauri Saxena developed a 'Smoke Absorber', to remove harmful fumes, smoke, and particulates from the air during soldering, welding, or other industrial processes

Psychology student, Sanidhya Sharma proposed 'Stroop Experiment' to remove harmful fumes, smoke, and particulates from the air during soldering, welding, or other industrial processes.

Rhea Sinha developed a 'Forgiveness and Resilience' demonstration goal to determine whether similar relationships exist for our current sample of students as well, and if so, what their strengths and directions are.

Computer Science students Aurica Ningthoujam and Bhavika Srivastava developed 'River Cleaning Boat' to collect the floating debris aquatic plants in reservoirs, rivers, lakes and seashores

and is implemented using a hydraulic system for the harvesters and high-quality sealing equipment is used for all the hydraulic parts.

Sakshi developed 'Alcohol Detection with Engine Non-Functioning System'.

Shambhavi and Sheetal proposed Automatic 'Zebra Crossing' which will rotate when the traffic signal is red on which the pedestrian can cross the road and a ramp stops the vehicles from passing.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (ECA)

A wide array of ECA societies spanning across all areas of creativity and passion; dance, debate, music, drama, fine arts, photography, filmmaking, quizzing and theater nurtured young talents and provided avenues for excellence, while making life in college dynamic, vibrant and joyful. The year offered many brilliant moments for team ECA with huge support from the entire college community. Indraprastha College not only impressed the University community with its organizational acumen but also won the First Prize with a mesmerizing *Jeng Bihu* performance. Over the years more collaboration followed with the Culture Council and the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR). The year closed with the immensely successful *G20 Academia-Cultural Indulgence: 50 Years of South Korea-Bharat Friendship*, a collaboration with the University of Delhi. It was a tapestry of intellectual and artistic exchange over two days. Each ECA society also excelled in its respective creative field.

Abhivyakti, the Dramatics Society had a very creative and productive year. The society began the year with intensive training for new members, focusing on essential skills and fostering a shared understanding of dramatic arts. The team won accolades in competitions and showcase events across the University of Delhi and other prestigious institutes, the most prestigious being the Best Play award at the National Drama Competition organized by the Shakespeare Society, Zakir Hussain College, University of Delhi. The inter-college and inter-university festival season was a bustling one for the Dramatics Society with one prize in stage production and nine in street play category. Abhivyakti successfully hosted its own much popular Street Play Competition *Chauraha 2023* at college which attracted the most talented dramatics teams of the University. The high point of the team was their special performances on the theme *Unity in Diversity* and on the menace of Air Pollution under the aegis of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change.

Afroza, the Western Dance Society started the year with enthusiastic participation in the inter-college festival season across the University. The team won top prizes and special mentions in five competitions including the first prize in Dance Roulette Championship organized at Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, University of Delhi. The society successfully organized its Western Group Dance Competition, *WhackyFeet*, as part of the annual college festival 'Shruti 2023' where teams from fifteen colleges performed and won exciting prizes. The team organized flash mobs and dance routines on special occasions like the celebration of *Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav* or *Aikyam* (ऐक्यम्), a

festival celebrating 'unity', organized by the Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC) of the college on Unity Day 2023.

Alaap, is the Indian Music Society of the college. Alaap performed to mark the beginning of every special occasion celebrated at the college in the year 2023 with its auspicious and soulful rendition of *Saraswati Vandana* and *Kulgeet* of the University of Delhi. With impressive discipline and self-learning quality, Alaap remained a popular team at the University Indian Music Circuit. It successfully hosted the *Ninaad 2023* during the annual College Fest. The highpoint of the team 2023 was the First Prize with *Jeng Bihu* performance at the first ever Inter-College Folk Orchestra Music Competition organized by the Culture Council, University of Delhi in collaboration with Indraprastha College.

Croydon, the Fine Arts Society engaged in continuous enhancement of creativity of its members and represented the college and the society at various inter-college and inter-university competitions. The society conducted various in-house sessions for its members for sharing of knowledge about diverse mediums and numerous styles of art. Croydon's exhibition-and-sale stalls have been superlatively successful for merchandise created by the society members or the face painting stalls or their ingenious selfie-points. The society collaborated with various other societies and Project teams for successful observance of landmark occasions including *Amrit Kalash Yatra*, *Wetlands Restoration Awareness Day*, *Unity Day*, *India's G20 Presidency* among many others. The society's collaboration with the Fine Arts Society of IIT Delhi for an Art walk was a fruitful exercise in co-learning beyond the college space.

Erudite, the Quiz Society engaged its 500 plus members on the art of quizzing. The society conducted quizzes like the *World Radio Day Quiz* on Instagram, *Indian History Quiz* on Google meet. Active participation was seen even during Semester breaks. English Debating Society had an engaging year that began with the prestigious K.K. Birla Memorial Debate in January 2023. The debate was held over two days in a hybrid format. The preliminary round was conducted online where sixteen teams participated out of which eight teams made it to the second round. Participation came from across educational institutions like Delhi Technological University, Indian Institute of Technology Delhi, Lady Shri Ram College for Women, Miranda House, Hansraj College, Kirori Mal College, among many. The society held regular training sessions (both online and offline) for its members to help them get acquainted with debating skills and with the different formats of debating forms. These sessions were conducted by senior members of the society as well as by experts from the field of debating and public speaking. About thirty of its members had remarkable participation in the Delhi debating circuit throughout the year.

La Cadenza, the Western Music Society continued to promote musical talent and foster a vibrant musical community. The society performed at the Martyrs Day Commemoration on January 30, 2023. The Society organized two events; *Arietta*, the Solo singing competition, and *Rhapsody*, the Choir competition during the IPCW Annual Fest *Shruti 2023*. The members of the Western Music Society actively participated in various competitions across the colleges in the University of Delhi showcasing their talents on a broader stage and fostering a sense of community and collaboration. The Western Music Society's endeavors in 2023 were marked by excellence, creativity, and musical enrichment.

Mridang, the Indian Dance Society is an inclusive platform that aspires to celebrate the cultural diversity of India by practicing and promoting different dance forms. The year began with a captivating Kathak Lecture Demonstration by the talented Ms. Shikha Sharma. Mridang enthralled the audience with an Indian Classical Fusion dance at the interactive session with the Fulbright Scholars' team from USIEF who visited the college early this year. Mridang hosted 'Naaz' - the Inter College Folk Dance Competition as part of the Annual College Festival. Mridang's performances in college and elsewhere have not only delighted everyone but also have beautifully showcased a kaleidoscope of Bharat's cultural richness, featuring Kathak, Bharatnatyam, Mohiniyattam, Odishi, Sattriya, Kollatam, Garba and Kalbeliya.

Simulacra's film team and photography team participated in numerous inter-college competitions and won accolades, including at Kirori Mal College, Sri Venkateswara College, Shri Ram College of Commerce, Maharaja Agrasen College and IIT Kanpur. The most rewarding moment for the society was the week-long film-screening to commemorate *Meri Maati Mera Desh*, aptly themed *Veeron ka Vandan, Mitti ko Naman* to salute the gallant soldiers of the nation. The festival was a massive success with packed venues till late in the afternoons.

SPORTS

The Department of Physical Education, Indraprastha College for Women organized a Chess Competition for college students. The event was conducted from 3 February to 4 February 2023 in the College Gymnasium. Total 54 students registered for this competition from different departments out of which 36 students participated. Total 7 rounds were conducted from which the 1st round was a knock out round. Winners of the 1st round then had matches against each other. First position was awarded to Pracheta Agarwal from B.com Hons (2nd year), followed by Manya Diptam from Sociology department (2nd year) at second and Ananya Jaisal from B.com Hons (1st year) at third.

The Department of Physical Education, Indraprastha College for Women under the aegis of Delhi University Sports Council, University of Delhi organized the Inter-College Netball Championship (women) 2022-23 from 06.02.2023 to 09.02.2023. The tournament saw participation from 15 prestigious women's colleges and over 100 hundred netball players affiliated to the University of Delhi participated in the tournament. The Department organized a 3 on 3 Women's Basketball Competition on 24 March, 2023. The opening remark for the event was given by Principal Prof. Poonam Kumria. Guest of the day was Ms. Vidhya Ramanarayana, an International Basketball player. The event was open for all the schools, colleges and clubs. Total 44 teams registered for the tournament. The top 3 teams were awarded with cash prizes and trophies along with certificates were given to all the participating teams.

A shooting competition was organized on 27 March on the occasion of Annual Festival, Shruti. It was an open competition for all the students. There were a total 18 registrations for the competition from both male and female category.

The Department of Physical Education, Indraprastha College for Women organized a workshop on meditation in collaboration with Centre for Yoga and Well- being under the Aegis of IQAC. This event was conducted by Dr. Ajay Shastri who is a Yoga Expert and Assistant Professor at Jawaharlal Nehru University. The event was conducted on 24 April 2023 in the college auditorium.
