

### Webinar Series: "Interdisciplinary Enquiries in Theory and Methods"

We heard and learnt from the experiences of our speakers of undertaking their own research. In particular they spoke about their academic journeys and the reasons behind the choice of their methodology. The webinar series touched the following themes:

- a) In what ways does interdisciplinary research map better onto real world research problems than discipline based research?
- b) How have interdisciplinary fields arisen and developed in their own research journey?
- c) How does one engender interdisciplinary research within universities, departments, research groups and for individual researchers?

Dr. Kumar prepared a presentation for the participants through which she elaborately explained the different aspects of interdisciplinarity. After the speaker's address there was a brief Q and A round where pertinent questions were raised by the participants and answered by the speaker.


