Discussion on 'Ambedkar's Philosophy and Contemporary Constitutional Praxis' Date: 30 April 2021 Time: 5:00 PM-6:30 PM

Discussion Forum organised an online event on Ambedkar's Philosophy and Contemporary Constitutional Praxis on 30 April 2021. This sixth event in the series on 'The Constitution of India: Cornerstone of our Nation' was moderated by Dr Pankaj Sahani of the Department of Political Science, Indraprastha College for Women. The discussion referred to Ambedkar's introduction to the draft Constitution in the Constituent Assembly on 4 November 1948 and linked the core ideas of Ambedkar's philosophy with the contemporary constitutional praxis.
