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ABOUT NIDAAN PAKHWARA

Date: 19th September-3rd October

‘Shramdaan’ is the annual student volunteer program organized by B.A. Program which this year has been organized in collaboration with Project Nidaan as “*Nidaan Pakhwara.*” Nidaan is the **Waste Management** project by our college.

It is a **15 days** long volunteering activity for **1 hour daily** in the free slots of all the participants. Every student is allotted a task related to waste management that includes:

- Collection of papers and other recyclable items from college and hostels.
- Keeping an eye on waste segregation.
- Maintaining a record of usage of dustbins.
- Sensitization and awareness campaign.

We started with the online registrations for the event on 13th September and closed the registrations on 16th September. Around 50 students from B.A. Program fraternity registered themselves to be the volunteers for the event. The volunteers were divided into three groups :

Group A: Hostel

Group B: Sensitization and Awareness

Group C: Others (Clean-a-thon, Collection drives and Surveys)

EVENT WORK PLAN

B. A. Program fraternity, along with other departments and societies of the college, was given a major responsibility to sensitize people and ensure major participation in Project Nidaan which is a solid waste management project aiming at 'No waste leaves the campus', taken up by Centre for Earth Studies, Indraprastha College for Women. B. A. Program thus conducted its annual event Shramdaan as Nidaan Pakhwara focusing towards the same cause.

The first major task was to make sure the students not only register but also work actively since this event was all about dedication, responsibility and participation of the volunteers. After the registration were completed, the council members prepared a work plan for the whole event which was then approved by Dr Shagufta, coordinator, B. A. Program and Dr Anindita Roy Saha, Convenor, Centre for Earth Studies.

Planning was done in two halves. First half of planning revolved around first week of event and second half focused on the second week. Day wise schedules were made keeping in mind the free slots of all the volunteers. Slots for all activities such as collection drive, clean-a-thon, documentary screening, awareness spreading drive etc. were decided.

For better coordination, student coordinator of the event and various group heads were made. One day before the event, a meeting was called of all the volunteers to brief them about their tasks and duties. While the event was going on, the entire group heads met the students' coordinator and other union members on daily basis to discuss the challenges faced by them and to listen to suggestion which they had so that the improvements could be done. Group heads coordinated and communicated with the volunteers on a constant basis to make sure there is smooth functioning and all tasks are completed.

Daily and weekly reports were also made to ensure documentation of the full event. Attendance records along with visual documentation were also done which can be found in the report that follows.

Task – Waste Segregation

From 19th September, 2019 students of ‘Group-B’ commenced the event of ‘Nidaan Pakhwara’. On the very first day the students of ‘group B’ were given the duty to spread awareness regarding waste segregation through placards, posters and small interactive sessions. They were allocated to different places of the college. Volunteers were asked to interact with people and was given a whistle to blow whenever they find something littering around the college campus. Gurdeep Kaur head of the group was supervising the volunteers, by dividing their working slots and by making sure the work is done properly. Vaishali Sharma second head of the group was handling the record of attendance of the volunteers. In the initial days both of them with the volunteers went to canteen, ECA Block, corridors and campaigned by stating the issues and points regarding ‘Nidaan Pakhwara’ and about #SeetiBajao. Throughout the week volunteers allotted to different places spread the awareness regarding usage of dustbins with different colors, conveying the aim of ‘Shramdaan’ and the reason behind of whistling. Kashish third head of the group was responsible for framing the daily report of the work done by the volunteers.



Problems Faced By the Volunteers

- Volunteers were not able to manage their time.
- After 2-3 days people were not showing interest on them.
- Internals and assignments were the main obstacle

Feedback

- People were very impressed by the team work.
- Volunteer’s interaction was appreciated.
- Now people are using dustbins wisely.
- Mostly People were interested in #seetibajao

Students were not adequately aware of all the types of dustbins, waste segregation, role of micro plastic etc. Therefore, the volunteers helped them to understand about all of these with the help of posters, videos, short movies and seeti. It left a great impact upon the students and now they are also actively participating in Nidaan Pakhwara and promoting it.

Impact (Overall Effectiveness) – The overall event was successful and it did make a small change. People now use right dustbins for the waste. The volunteers and heads also got to know about the seriousness of the problem by they would now follow the 3 R(s) - Reuse, Recycle & Reduce formula at their individual level.

Activeness of Participant – All the volunteers performed their task actively and honestly. Most of them were present in all the movie screenings. They listened to the heads' instructions and followed them Along with picking the waste around; they also used to aware the people about waste segregation and collected the plastic which could be reused.

Problems Faced by the Volunteers – The event was very long and so the volunteers got tired of doing the same work throughout the whole week. Initially, they worked with enthusiasm but gradually, they were bored and tired.

Suggestions from Volunteers – The event could have been more effective if it would have been shorter. In the canteen area, students don't use the right dustbins and sometimes leave their waste on the tables or on the ground. Many Students are aware of the use of the dustbins but they don't use the right dustbin even then due to their laziness or not knowing about the actual impact it has on the environment. The college can organize events to make students aware about the problem through video clips .The students used to listen to the volunteers but some of them didn't follow what was told to them. The number of dustbins in the canteen and the ground can be increased.

Impact (Overall Effectiveness) – The response was quite good and we were able to collect a carton of recyclable material. The whole college was targeted for the drive and all the departments were invited for the same but it was observed that BA Program students were more involved and cooperative as compared to students from other departments. The collected material will be sent to the Centre for Earth studies and they will in turn, send the material for recycling forward.

Activeness of Participants – Most of the volunteers were active; merely one or two volunteers were there who weren't as enthusiastic about the task as others. There was smooth communication between the heads and the volunteers. Overall the experience was great and the volunteers were cooperative enough. The experience of interaction with students from other departments was also a major take away for everyone.

Problems Faced by the Volunteers – Some of the college students were disrespectful towards the volunteers but they managed to keep calm and continue with their task at hand. Also, they faced difficulty while communicating with people because of shyness or lack of confidence sometimes.

Survey Group's Report

Tasks: All the five members conducted surveys. The target areas of surveys were washrooms and canteen.

Impact: The students who participated in the surveys gave valuable suggestions. Those who were unable to answer our volunteers sensitized them on this waste management issues and told them ways to reduce waste on a daily basis.

How Active: Volunteers were quite active in conduction of surveys as they understood the essence of waste management drive.

Problems Faced: Volunteers faced problems when the college students were not interested in answering the questions. That is the reason why videos of the survey usually ended with a yes/no answer and not a detailed one.

Analysis of the Survey-

The common questions asked during the surveys were:

1. Do you feel our canteen is hygienic?
2. Do you think more dustbins should be placed near the canteen area?
3. Should plastic straws be replaced with paper straws?

4. Do you think that washrooms need to be improved?

Response: The answers to such these questions were mostly **YES**, that the canteen and washrooms should be more hygienic and need improvements and this could be done by general awareness among all.

Awareness Level inferred: The students at first were **not so aware** or sensitized but during these surveys we got good responses from them and we hope they will be careful from now onwards.

Suggestions by Respondents:

- One of the common suggestions for the canteen was that, the “students should keep their plates back after finishing their meals and should not wait for the canteen workers to come and do all those tasks for them.”
- They found canteen being moderate in the terms of hygiene, i.e., it is neither so bad nor so good.
- Majority of the students wanted that, plastic straws should be replaced by paper straws, because they are biodegradable and hygienic.
- The washrooms should be more hygienic and the students should take care of that as well by not throwing waste or water.

GROUP HEAD COMMENTS

While working as a volunteer for Nidaan Pakhwara, I have observed that besides having Green and Blue dustbins on every floor, students don't bother to segregate their waste before throwing it away. Many a time chips packets, plastic bottles are there in the green bin.

Besides that, in the paper collection drive we didn't face any difficulty as such. Students respond in a positive manner when we tell them that these papers will be recycled.

Individually I am enjoying my work. There are two more volunteers – Muskan Beniwal and Sathwika. Both of them are active volunteers. As a team, when we get positive feedback from students, it gives us motivation to work with more dedication.

To start with the task, two of our volunteers went around the residents of the K.G Hostel on a daily basis to collect various recyclable items, in that they collected bundles of newspapers, plastic bottles and cardboard. While collecting these items they also told the importance of waste management and to minimize the use of plastic materials specifically single used plastics. Some of them clicked pictures around hostel and college campus of waste segregation and dustbins and they observed that people still throw waste in any dustbin regardless of knowing about biodegradable and non-biodegradable materials. So, they told people to throw waste in proper dustbins and made them aware about biodegradable and non-biodegradable materials. Also, our volunteers also observed that there is only one dustbin in classroom for all the waste. While doing their duties two of our volunteers observed behind canteen area that people don't throw wrappers of food items and so they just lie on the ground and therefore it goes inside cats and monkeys' stomach which is a major concern. Therefore, volunteers made people realize the importance of throwing waste in proper dustbins.

As a part of this team and heading it , the group heads too collected recyclable materials from our hostel residents and kept a record of duties done by our volunteers and made daily reports .

The primary objective of this event was to make the students aware of the waste that is being produced around and by us. This event also focused on providing effective solutions to the problem. The volunteers made posters on used paper, thus recycling paper and spreading awareness near the canteen areas, classrooms, field, library and hostel. Volunteers were asked to interact with the students and given a whistle to blow whenever they find someone littering around the college campus. Every volunteer was utilizing their free slots to interact with the college students. The project hashtag (#)seetibajao was also created to spur the momentum in college regarding the project.

Since it is a hot topic, everybody knows about it, yet the students were not very active about this project and weren't keen on participating. Even after knowing about the waste segregation, students didn't use the dustbins accordingly. Some volunteers find this way of interaction amazing but some were doing just for the sake of certificate and only for the attendance. This mega project is ended on October 5, 2019 but this event really helped us to gain experience regarding management, coordination and planning..

Our experience as a whole was really good. We learned ways to probe the problem. It's been two weeks now and we do see students now using the right dustbins and this makes our event a great success.

Date: 27th September 2019


Time: 2:30 pm onwards

Time: 2:30 pm onwards


