In continuation of the commemorative lecture series that was started in 2014-15, “Commemorating the Centenary of Mahatma Gandhi’s Return to India from South Africa (1915-2015)”, the Gandhi Study Circle organized Lecture IV of the series. Professor Ashok Vohra from the Department of Philosophy, University of Delhi spoke on ‘Swadeshi: the Sure Means of Eradication of Poverty & Corruption’.

Professor Vohra has published several research papers and articles in national and international research journals, anthologies and newspapers. He is the author of *Wittgenstein’s Philosophy of Mind* (London, Sydney, 1986) and is the co-author of *Radhakrishnan: His Life and Ideas* (New York, 1990).

Professor Vohra spoke eloquently about how one could become financially strong, Swadeshi as a natural duty for patriotic individuals, and about how it could help in the eradication of corruption. Students participated very enthusiastically in the question answer session that followed.

## **Pink Chain Campaign 2015**

Cancer Awareness Programme

Chief Guest: Dr. Kiran Bedi, Social Activist and Ramon Magsaysay Awardee

11 September 2015

The Pink Chain Campaign is an initiative of Punarjeevan to raise about the wide spreading disease: cancer. The campaign includes public demonstration of self-examination techniques, distribution of pamphlets, and speaker sessions to disseminate information about breast cancer.

In collaboration with the National Service Scheme, the Gandhi Study Circle organized a session in college to spread awareness and initiate a dialogue about breast cancer. The Chief Guest for the occasion was the social activist and Ramon Magsaysay Awardee Dr. Kiran Bedi. The Principal, Dr. Babli Moitra Saraf, addressed the gathering.

In her address to the gathering of over 500 students, Dr. Bedi spoke about how she emotionally connects to this cause because of a family member being affected by the disease. She emphasized on the need for prioritizing health through regular physical activity, regular health checkups and mammography. Dr. Abhishek Shankar, the founder and chief coordinator of the Pink Chain Campaign addressed the gathering and apprised the audience of how the campaign was planned across thirty three colleges, with over one thousand volunteers. Dr. Ravi Mehrotra, Director at the Institute of Cytology and Preventive Oncology, Noida made an informative presentation about the symptoms, prevention and the cure of breast cancer. Dr. Piyush Ranjan, AIIMS Delhi, addressed the questions raised by the audience. Dr. Preetha Rajaramanan, the South Asia program Director for USA Center for Global Health participated in a panel discussion with Dr. Abhishek Shankar, Dr. Ravi Mehrotra and Dr. Piyush Ranjan on the prevention of breast cancer, the maintenance of a healthy lifestyle and misconceptions about cancer. Brochures for cancer awareness were distributed at the end of the session.

## **Gandhi Jayanti**

The Gandhi Study Circle coordinated with the Students' Union in the celebration of Gandhi Jayanti in college. The event started with the lighting of the lamp by the Principal, Dr. Babli Moitra Saraf. The Indian Music Society of college gave a beautiful rendition of the Ramdhun. Pragati Tripathi presented a paper on 'Gandhi's Return to India from South Africa'. Ashwini Thakur and Akansha Verma, members of the Gandhi Study Circle hosted a power point presentation on 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan' highlighting Gandhi's vision of a clean India, and the initiatives taken by the college to work towards this vision.
