



Combined Annual Training Camp 2018

Combined Annual Training Camp or CATC is a ten-day camp organized by each Battalion twice a year. Every NCC cadet from school and college has to attend at least one of them to be eligible for NCC 'B' or 'C' Certificate exams that are conducted annually. It comprises many competitions between the schools and colleges of the unit.

This year 58 cadets of the NCC Unit of Indraprastha College for Women attended the camp that was organized in June 2018 and Nov 2018 by 2 Delhi Girls Battalion at NCC Bhawan in Rohini, Delhi. The camp focused on teaching both theoretical and practical subjects and learnings of NCC and general knowledge.

Theoretical classes in the camp covered the topics of Drill, Health & Hygiene, History of NCC, Firing, basics of Field & Battle Craft. Practical classes included lessons of Tent pitching, Disaster Management, Drill, Guard of honor etc and primarily focused on Wing specific activities. The camp acted as refresher training for the cadets who were also trained in basic skills of survival and emergencies besides other topics. Cadets were introduced to weapons such as a .22 caliber rifle and attended firing practices on selected days. Cultural and Sports events were also an important and integral part of the camp with relevant prizes and medals for winners.

The main competitions that were conducted included Squad Drill Competition, Tug of War, Debate Competition, Dance and Singing Competitions (Group and Solo), Firing Competition, Tent Pitching Competition etc. Cadets were also assigned the activity called "dogwatch" in the camp wherein two cadets are to stay on "santri" duty for two hours at any time given time of the day.








CHIEF MINISTER'S RALLY CAMP, 25th JANUARY 2019

REPUBLIC DAY CAMP: RAJPATH 2019



Total of 1850 NCC Cadets are selected from 17 directorates to attend this 30 day camp in which they represent their respective battalions and directorates. To be a part of this camp cadets have to go through a long process of selection, which begins six months before 26th January. Various camps are held within that time frame to select and train the deserving cadets like the IGC (Inter-Group Competition) and Pre-RDC's. There are three Pre RDCs held in order to serve the purpose and many training camps for the cadet participants of Best Cadet and YEP competition. After a rigorous training of almost two months, cadets make it to final RDC and come out as the bearers of the most prodigious badge that is The Seven Corner RDC badge.

The Camp is inaugurated by the Vice President of India. There, various competitions are conducted among the directorates to decide the Champion Directorate for award by Prime Minister's Banner.
