


Students Presentation - Republic Day





•	In 1926, he founded the Naujawan Bharat Sabha.
	 This organisation aimed to encourage revolution against British rule by rallying the peasants and workers.
	 Singh served as the organisation's secretary.
•	In 1928, he established the Hindustan Socialist Republican Association (HSRA) along with Sukhdev. Chandrashekhar Azad and others.
•	Lala Lajpat Rai died in 1928 as a result of injuries sustained in a police lathi charge on the orders of a
	Superintendent of Police, James Scott.
	 Bhagat Singh and his revolutionary friends decided to average the death of the dear leader.
	· However, in a case of mistaken identity, they assassinated another police official J P Saunders.
	 This was part of the Lahore Conspiracy Case.
	 After this incident, Singh fied from Lahore and made changes to his appearance.
٠	Central Assembly Bombing Case
	 Bhagat Singh was also involved in this case.
	 On 8th April 1929, Singh and Batukeshwar Dutt threw a bomb in the Central Assembly at Delhi, from the Visitors' Gallery.
	 They also threw pamphlets and raised pro-revolutionary slegans.
	 Both the revolutionaries courted arrest since they wanted to spread their message of revolution and anti-imperialism, and needed a platform for ≥.
	 Nobody was hurt in the incident, and it was never their intention to cause physical harm to anyone. Their stated aim was 'to make the deaf hear'.
	· Bhagat Singh was the mastermind behind the incident, and he was inspired by Auguste Vailant, a
	French anarchist, who was executed by France for a similar incident in Paris.
	 In the trial that ensued, both Singh and Dutt were sentenced to transportation for life.



Blood Donation Awareness Session

National Service Scheme, Indraprastha College for Women organized a blood donation awareness session in collaboration with blood connect on 2nd march, 2022 via Google meet at 6pm. 69 volunteers were present. The session commenced with an introduction to the speaker - Kanishka - by Srishti Rastogi, the Treasurer of NSS, IPCW. Kanishka briefly talked about Blood Connect. Then, she talked about the importance of donating blood by the youth with the help of a presentation. She explained the process of donating blood and the criteria to be fulfilled. She busted some myths surrounding blood donation and conducted a small activity to realistically demonstrate the amount of pain felt during drawing of blood. Further, data was presented through graphs showing the decline in the no. of donors during covid and the increase in camp donors that turned into walk-in donors indicating awareness. She further conducted a quiz and there was active participation by the volunteers. Information was provided about the criteria a regular donor, a recovered donor, and a vaccinated person should know before donating blood during the pandemic. She explained the several benefits of blood donation. A diet chart was presented with the aim to help improve hemoglobin levels. She elucidated on the initiatives of blood connect regarding blood donation and their current pan India awareness drive 'BAANT LE BANDEYA' and their aim to normalize blood donation. Volunteer participation was encouraged in the awareness drive. She elaborated some more about Blood Connect and addressed doubts. Finally, the session was concluded as Srishti gave a vote of thanks addressing Kanishka and the volunteers for their participation.



Poster Making Competition on Anti-Terrorism Day




Webinar on Breast Cancer Awareness


