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Principal's Address

Distinguished Chief Guest, Shri Raghvendra Singh, Distinguished Alumna, Saachi Soni, Esteemed Chairman and Members of the Governing Body, Dear Colleagues, Friends and Beloved Students:

I welcome you all and take this opportunity to congratulate the entire College community and all those who have walked with us on this journey for 97 long years. It is important to put on record that the year 2020 has been an extraordinary year for the entire world. Also, for the first time in conscious memory, the Annual Day of the College is being held online, and without the familiar and welcome buzz of activity among students, teachers, non-teaching staff and other stakeholders. When the media of communication transform, it is inevitable that the format of the message also change. Therefore, this year the College has been constrained to launch the Annual Report online, and the Principal's address to the College community online has been accordingly abbreviated, and transmitted on YouTube. All acknowledgement of faculty, staff and students with details have been included in the printed version of this report. The College thanks all faculty and administrative staff for their inputs for the Principal's Report 2020.

The Annual Student Magazine Aaroh is being launched online, along with its audio version for students with visual disability, as per practice. The College thanks Dr. Divya Mehta and her team for the mammoth effort of putting together this milestone issue of Aaroh. The sixth edition of the Heritage Calendar, compiled by Dr. Meena Bhargava and Dr. Vinita Sinha, is being released on the occasion.

The online Teaching-Learning System, online submission of Internal Assessment Data, online Open Book Examination, and the online Admission process, totally contactless, have been the most significant developments and learning experiences, as well as achievements, of the year gone by. All these continue till the situation relents to permit full physical presence on the campus. However, a fall out of the situation for the Annual Report and for this College Day, has been the non-availability of the consolidated form of student results, due to which the assessment of the eligibility of merit position holders, prizes and scholarships has not been possible. The College has, therefore, been prevented from conducting its annual prize distribution, which is an intrinsic part of the College Day celebrations. As soon as the data on results is available, the College will produce a supplement to the Principal's Report with the record of recipients of prizes and scholarships in 2019-2020, and the situation permitting, an independent event will be organized to award and felicitate all prize winners.

The College records with grateful appreciation, the unstinting commitment, effort and dedication of our non-teaching colleagues, who, throughout the period of lockdown, have negotiated unprecedented circumstances and novel experiences, to ensure that the entire online system functions like clock-work at all levels.

It is significant to record that Mr. Manish Kumar Sinha, Assistant, was appointed by the College as the Nodal Officer for the Open Book Examination, who, along with his team, discharged duties with remarkable dexterity and dedication, under the overall supervision of Dr. Jyoti Trehan Sharma, Vice-Principal. The Internal Assessment component of the College was flawlessly compiled by the team led by Ms. Renu Chaudhary, and student options for papers were received online via Google forms. The College especially acknowledges the conduct of the online and contactless Admission Process by Dr. Archana Singhal and her team of teachers and support staff.

The Accounts Section was physically present every single month without fail to carry on the task of calculation of salaries to be released on time, to both permanent and contractual non-teaching staff. The College Governing Body took the compassionate decision to continue to pay subsistence level salaries to its large number of employees. The essential service staff of the College, both permanent and contractual, ensured that the vast heritage property of the College, its lawns and trees were maintained, and hygiene and cleanliness was at its peak during the dire months of the onset of the pandemic.

Pursuing its vision of Diversity Inclusion and Integration, the College provided a vital and active support structure to conduct Online Teaching-Learning for students with disabilities (PwBD). In keeping with this, the College's Audio Repository Application, Lecture Hall, developed for the use of Visually Impaired (VI) students under the College's Internal Research Program, was made accessible to students across the University. The College acknowledges the efforts of Dr. B. R Alamelu, Convener, Equal Opportunity Cell, and Dr. Dolly Jain, Convenor, Enabling Unit, for their efforts.

The College received 315 applications for financial assistance and waivers. With the support of the Governing Body, financial relief in the form of full fee waivers was provided to BPL students, and Fee Concession, Instalment payments, and other kinds of assistance was extended to each and every student who had applied. The College also provided laptops to all students who requisitioned for the same.

The College received 23 cheques from All India Confederation of the Blind towards final instalment of the Marga Schultze Merit Scholarship to 23 VI students.

The Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC) and the Enabling Unit (EU) of the College successfully facilitated a total of 54 scholarship applications for the current academic year, of which 34 have already been accepted by the concerned agencies and 20 are in process, with the proactive efforts of the College administration.

As the College closed its gates and regulated entry and exit to safeguard the community, it also took care to see that its animals and birds on campus, as well as the strays on the roads outside, were kept fed and in comfort.

The College National Service Scheme (NSS) continued to conduct its Outreach Activities online under the supervision of Ms. Jeya Christy and Dr. Shubhra Seth.

The College continued to offer counselling services online throughout the period of the lockdown. The College Counsellor, Ms. Lalita Kaushik, is thanked for her dedication, commitment and comprehensive handling of the situation.

The College National Cadet Corps (NCC) organized two webinar sessions on 'Uncertainty for Youth after Lockdown and Battling COVID-19'.

The College launched its flagship online platform IPCW-ON, with the posting of the Electronic College Prospectus, and further facilitated all online activities of the College. To enhance network connectivity on campus, a Mobile Tower has been installed on the College campus. The Dry Lab and Wet Lab for B.Sc. (Hons.) Environmental Science course are ready for operation in the forthcoming academic session.

All Department Welcome and Farewell functions, and other academic activities and festivals, were shifted online, to keep the College Event Calendar buzzing.

The College improved its NIRF ranking, moving up 10 positions to the 43rd rank, within a brief span of two years.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) held its Annual Academic Audit in the online Academic Congress of the Staff Council to review and initiate the academic agenda and pedagogical practices for the session, and decide upon strategies to implement the academic calendar of the University and the College.

The College has successfully filed the Annual Quality Assurance Report July 2019-June 2020 within the time prescribed and is now in the process of preparing for the 2nd Cycle of NAAC Accreditation. It has initiated the process of preparing its Institutional Information for Quality Assessment (IIQA).

A week-long Faculty Development Program (FDP) on 'Basics of Online Teaching and Learning' was organized by the Department of Computer Science under the aegis of IQAC from 24-30 July 2020 on IPCW-ON. The Department of Computer Science also prepared a Tutorial on Google Classroom for students to gain a better understanding of the tool and its uses.

The College conducted 70 National and International Webinars, 27 Departmental Events, 9 Online Quizzes, International Yoga Day, 1 FDP, and 6 Workshops.

The highlights of the same were events with international collaborations like the international Students' Workshop on 'Sufism in South Asia: A View from Delhi' which was organized by the Department of History in collaboration with Institute of Iranian Studies, Georg-August-Universitat Göttingen from 6-8 January 2020.

The Translation and Translation Studies Centre of the College in collaboration with New York University, South Asian Language Programs and Columbia University, Hindi-Urdu Language Programs, organized an International Hindi Conference on 'Hindi Global Perspectives: Language, Literature and Translation' from 9-11 January 2020. The conference was supported by Indian Council for Cultural Relations.

The Department of Environmental Studies under the aegis of the Centre for Earth Studies organized a month long online Certificate Course in 'Ecology, Environment and Sustainability' to expand

opportunities for graduate training and faculty collaboration across colleges and universities in India with a focus on methods and policy issues.

The Centre for Inter-Disciplinary Studies (CIDS) organized a webinar series on 'Interdisciplinary Enquiries in Theory and Methods'.

The Sanskrit Studies and Research Centre (SSRC) of the College organized an online Inter-College Paper Presentation competition on the theme 'Sanskrit in the Global Context'.

The Centre for Yoga and Well-Being, in collaboration with NSS, organized a Virtual Yoga Session under the Fit India Campaign.

The College hosted an International Student Symposium on 'English Studies and Learning in India', with researchers from the Department of Learning and Teaching, University of San Diego, California and the students and faculty of the Departments of English and B.A. Program of the College on 20 January 2020.

The College signed an MOU with Middlebury School, Vermont, USA to encourage student exchange programs in the College.

The College proudly announces that 38 students were awarded the UN Millennium Fellowship for their outreach projects and initiatives in pursuit of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) and 18 students were appointed as Campus Ambassadors. The details of the same are enclosed in this report. Specially noteworthy are the outreach activities under Project Noor of the College and its collaboration with SANG to supply 900 face masks.

The student-initiated Project RISE, with the support of the EOC and EU, conducted two online Certificate courses on 'Resumé Building and Conversational Skills' and 'Personal Interview' with PwBD students.

The recently formed Science Society Ananta of the College, kept student interest and curiosity alive with online quizzes and talks.

The Centenary Decade Under-Graduate Research Grant 2020 was awarded to twelve students for six projects, across disciplines of the College.

The Commemorative Brochure 'Celebrating 20 Years' of the Department of Multi Media and Mass Communication was released on 28 April 2020, and is available on the College website.

The College observed International Women's Day on 6 March 2020 with the launch of 'The Women's Calendar'. The Calendar is significant in bringing forth the forgotten histories and paradigms of women's movements,

re-orienting professions identified with males to portray women at the helm of professional affairs.

The Department of Geography was especially active in 2020 and organized a five-day National Workshop from 8-12 September 2020 on the theme 'Interrogating "Anthropocene": Climate Change and the Unequal World'. It also organized a lecture series on the 'Future of Urban Space'. It launched its Community Outreach Programme—Project Dhyan, and several of its students won laurels at various events in the Colleges of the University.

For one of the UG Centenary Decade Research Grant 2019 projects, students of the Department of Geography created a 3D College Campus Map, Map of Classrooms, and an Interactive Map of the College, under the mentorship of Dr. Soma Sarkar.

An International Webinar on 'Introduction to Multi Media and Mass Communication Tools: From Theory to Practice' was organized by the Department of Multi Media and Mass Communication from 25-28 August 2020.

The Department of Political Science organized a lecture series on 'Modernity'.

The Gandhi Study Circle organized a lecture series on 'Gandhi and the Contemporary World' to conclude 150 years of Gandhi.

On the occasion of Constitution Day, the Discussion Forum of the College organized a documentary screening followed by a discussion on 'Samvidhan: The Making of the Constitution of India'.

The Student Union successfully organized the online Independence Day Celebration 2020 and Gandhi Jayanti 2020.

Under the stewardship of Dr. Vinita Kaul Dar, Advisor, CGPC, the Career Guidance and Placement Cell of the College organized a Global University Fair, Virtual Internship Fair, and online Placement Drive. It consolidated Companies for recruitment, including the Big 4 and others, and specially worked towards creating recruitment opportunities for PwBD students.

The College successfully completed the due stage of promotions of 51 colleagues and 2 non-teaching staff members. The College acknowledges the hours of meticulous scrutiny of documents by the Internal Screening Committee for promotions coordinated by Vice-Principal, Dr. Jyoti Trehan Sharma, Dr. Harsh Bala Sharma, and Mr. Dinesh Sundriyal with Ms. Nikita Gupta, Mr. Vinod Kumar, and Ms. Madhu Chauhan rendering crucial secretarial assistance.

On 29 February 2020, Principal, Prof. Babli Moitra Saraf, was selected as one of the 'Top 50 Exemplary Academic Administrators of Higher Education Institutes across India for the year 2019' by uLektz Wall of Fame, an initiative to identify, recognize and award the contributors of higher education. She was also invited by WISCOMP to be part of its 'Voices of Saahas' Exhibition, which featured resource persons who work around issues of gender, equity, and justice in educational spaces.

Prof. Saraf, along with Ms. Swaha Swetambara Das, Convener, Gandhi Study Circle, and Student Representative, Ms. Amisha Pareek, were felicitated on 2 October 2020 by Gandhi Bhawan, University of Delhi, on the occasion of Gandhi 150 years for 'Singular Contribution to the Promotion and Dissemination of Gandhian Thought (Gandhi Vichar Ke Prachar-Prasar Mein Apratim Yogdan Ke Liye)'.

Prof. Saraf was invited by Deloitte to address the Grand Finale of the Graduate School of Maverick, at its global gathering.

Dr. Meenakshi Khanna, Associate Professor, Department of History, received the Namaste+Fellowship.

Dr. Roopali Goyanka, Associate Professor, Department of Economics, was awarded a Consultancy with WHO to prepare a report on financial protection in use of health care services for member countries, per Sustainable Development Goals of UN.

Dr. Nawin Tiwary won the Best Film Award for his film Hide or Seek at CMS Vatavaran, a three minute film competition on the theme 'Biodiversity'.

Ms. Seema Jangra, Department of Computer Science, published a patent in Indian Patent Journal (Journal No. 02/2020, Page No. 1836) on 10 January 2020. Ms. Jangra has filed for yet another patent and is awaiting its publication.

Dr. Surbhi Kumar and Dr. Swati Jain from the Department of Psychology, and Dr. Madhulika Sonkar from the Department of Sociology, were conferred doctoral degrees.

In the constant effort towards updating and upgrading their knowledge and skills, several faculty members participated in Faculty Development Programs (FDPs) organized under the aegis of University of Delhi and Government of India. 4 teachers were involved in research projects, 4 published

books, 11 wrote 13 chapters in edited books, 21 published 34 research papers, 15 contributed 65 articles to newspapers and magazines, 4 wrote 6 book reviews, 31 presented 55 papers, 16 were chairpersons/discussants/panellists in conferences and workshops, 19 acted as resource persons, 21 were invited as speakers, 10 were engaged in curriculum development, 31 were involved in related academic activities and 4 won awards.

A number of our students across departments participated in various events of the Colleges of the University of Delhi, and other national and international bodies, to win laurels both in individual and/or institutional capacities. The details are recorded in the enclosed report.

The highlights are listed below:

Muskan Tyagi, English (Hons.) Semester 4 and Salika Rashid, B.A. (Program) Semester 4, presented a Paper 'Palestine-ing the Valley? Abrogation of Article 370 and its Aftermath', at the National Seminar 'Mission 370 and Beyond: Contemporary Narratives of Jammu and Kashmir,' organized by Rajdhani College, University of Delhi and sponsored by Indian Council of Social Science Research on 6-7 February 2020.

Muskan Tyagi and Salika Rashid were also placed in the First Position and received a cash prize of Rs. 5000/- for their paper titled 'Revisiting the Romantics: Contemporary Environmental Issues of the Capitalocene,' presented at the seminar held by the Literary Society, Kalindi College, University of Delhi, on 3 March 2020.

Yastika Sharma, Swastika Ojha, Bidhu Khanna and Aditi Singh of Geography (Hons.) Semester 4, won the Best Presentation Award and a Cash Prize of Rs. 2000/- for 'Women Seeking Safety while Commuting – Undemocratic City Design of Delhi,' presented at Jagriti Annual Fest, Women Study Centre, Jesus and Mary College, University of Delhi, on 6 March 2020.

Sanyukta Goyola, Psychology (Hons.) Semester 6, was selected in April 2020 as Peer Support Moderator, on a part-time basis, by Supportiv, the San Francisco based Anonymous Peer Support Network.

Poems by Yastika Sharma, Geography (Hons.) Semester 4, were published in an anthology in an e-book version by Swadhya Publishing House on 7 June 2020.

Ananya Gupta, Economics (Hons.) Semester 4, and her team participated in the World Asian Case Competition organized by Academy of Asian Business, Seoul. 500+ teams from around the world participated. Ananya Gupta's team was the First Undergraduate Team from India to qualify. On 8 August 2020, the team was declared 'Silver Cup Winners'.

The Annual Sports Day was held on 18 February 2020. It was the 10th year of the Sports Festival, which in 2020 received the name 'Tejas'. The Chief Guest was Mr. Ankur Mittal, National Shooter and recipient of the Arjuna Award. Virtual Fitness classes were held online with the College teams, by the Incharge, Physical Education and Sports. The title for the Vishwanath Bakshi Prize for Best Sportsperson was awarded to Ms. Deepaika, Political Science (Hons.) Semester 6.

The College instituted two running trophies in the National Drama Competition which it hosts for the Shakespeare Society of India: first, for 'Most Original Concept' and second, for 'Best Play in Shakespeare's Original Language'. These trophies were awarded in 2020.

The College observed the Vigilance Awareness Week with Slogan Writing, Poster Making and Logo Making Competitions in which various departments were involved.

The College won a total of 40 prizes at the 62nd Annual Flower Show of the University of Delhi, including the Delhi University Flower Show Committee Cup for the Best Vegetable Garden and the Department of Sociology Cup for the Best Rose Garden.

Activities with alumnae as resource persons were conducted in several departments especially in the B.A. Program Department.

The College organized its first online Annual Alumnae Meet on 8 November 2020, with enthusiastic global participation by our Alumnae.

The second Annual Shahzad R. Bahadur Memorial Debate was organized online this year in November 2020.

Two alumnae of the Department of Political Science-Pari Bishnoi and Moomal Raj Purohit-qualified in the Civil Services Examination 2020 and were placed in Ranks 30 and 173 respectively.

Two colleagues, Dr. Manasvini M. Yogi and Dr. Meena Bhargava, both alumnae of the College, retired in 2020. The College expresses grateful thanks for their contributions to the institution.

Upon the retirement of Dr. Meena Bhargava, Associate Professor, Department of History on 30 September 2020, the College Governing Body appointed her as the Academic Strategist and Chief Risk Officer of the College, with additional duty as the Supervising Coordinator, Department of MMMC, OSD, Department of Geography with the provision to continue taking classes in the Department of History as Guest Faculty.

Educational institutions are faced with the fresh challenge of implementing the National Education Policy (NEP), and wide ranging discussions are going on at various forums in the College.

The College is thankful to its Governing Body for the consistent support to all its activities and initiatives. The College lauds the devotion and commitment of the administrative and support staff under the able guidance of the Administrative Officer, Mr. Dinesh Sundriyal, Vice-Principal, Dr. Jyoti Trehan Sharma, and Bursar, Ms. Sushma Neena Kumar. I thank the Advisor, Student Union, Dr. Sarabjeet Kaur, Coordinator IQAC, Dr. Vinita Sinha, Academic Strategist and Chief Risk Officer, Dr. Meena Bhargava, Assistant Professor, Department of English, Ms. Srinjoyee Dutta, Data Manager, Ms. Nikita Gupta, who along with the teachers and administrative staff, have contributed in the compilation and presentation of the information for the Principal's Report and the College Day. I would like to specially mention the contribution of Mr. Gagan Gera, Assistant Professor, Department of Multi Media and Mass Communication and Mr. Rohit Rohilla, Technical Assistant, Department of Multi Media and Mass Communication, for editing and preparing the online material and transmission of the 98th College Day on YouTube.
