As we gather here for this historic event, I feel privileged to have the opportunity to share this moment with such a distinguished group of individuals.

It is an immense honor to welcome Smt. Rekha Gupta to Indraprastha College for Women on this momentous occasion of our centenary celebration. Her presence here today adds tremendous value to this prestigious event, and we are deeply grateful for her time and support. Smt. Rekha Gupta ji's leadership and vision have greatly contributed to the development of our great city, Delhi. As a passionate advocate for women's empowerment, education, and social welfare, her work has been transformative in uplifting communities and fostering a brighter, more inclusive future. Her unwavering dedication to progress and the betterment of society resonates deeply with the ethos of Indraprastha College, which has always strived to provide quality education to young women and empower them to become leaders in every field. Today, as we celebrate our college's remarkable journey, we are inspired by the milestones we have achieved, and we look forward to a future filled with even greater accomplishments. We thank Smt. Rekha Gupta for joining us in this celebration and for continuing to support education and women's empowerment. We are truly privileged to have you as our Chief Guest today!

I am filled with awe and admiration to share with you that on this date, 101 years ago i.e. on 9 April 1924, Indraprastha Girls' College, was recognized as an intermediate college by the University of Delhi, approved for preparing students for admission to degree courses at the University of Delhi. This was the first step for the formation of the college as we know it today! This momentous occasion marks a century-long legacy of academic excellence, empowerment, and the unwavering pursuit of knowledge. As we gather to celebrate this remarkable milestone, we honor the achievements of our talented students, dedicated faculty, and distinguished alumni who have contributed to shaping the history of this prestigious institution. The event will be a vibrant reflection of our rich cultural diversity and academic strength, with cultural performances,

awards, and speeches that highlight our journey and future aspirations. I invite all of you to join us in celebrating the enduring spirit of Indraprastha College, as we continue to nurture young women leaders and scholars who will go on to make significant contributions to society.

A breakthrough milestone in this prestigious journey is discovery of yet another historic date of 27 May 1924, the day which laid the foundation of the first Women's College in Delhi. On this day, three students of Indraprastha Girls' School sat for intermediate classes for the first time. This legacy that we carry, empowers us to strive ahead to achieve significant landmarks to add to the repertoire of IP's glory.

As we gather here today to celebrate the achievements of another remarkable year, I am pleased to share with you the significant milestones we have achieved through strategic collaborations. Over the past year, Indraprastha College has signed several Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) that have furthered our mission to enhance academic excellence and community engagement. On 19 February 2024, we signed an MoU with the Indian Council for World Affairs, followed by a partnership with the Center for Himalayan Studies, University of Delhi, on 25 April 2024. On 7 March 2024, we also signed an MoU with the Rekhi Foundation for Happiness. This was followed by a series of other collaborations, including with Green Mentors, Gujarat, on May 10, 2024, Samdrushti Kshamta Vikas evam Anusandhan Mandal (SAKSHAM) on September 4, 2024, and PGDAV College (Morning and Evening), University of Delhi, for an NPU alliance on August 23, 2024. In October, we formalized two additional agreements—one with Apmrutyu Nirvaran Sahay, Gujarat, on October 26, and another with Hindi Shiksha Parishad (UK) on 1 October 2024. These collaborations reflect our ongoing commitment to global partnerships, interdisciplinary growth, and the overall development of our institution.

On this momentous occasion today, it is only fitting to reflect upon the grand events that marked the year 2024—the centennial year of our beloved institution. This year has been a celebration of learning, innovation, culture, and community, as we commemorated 100 years of excellence in education and service.

Our centennial celebrations began with an International Conference on January 10th, coinciding with *Vishwa Hindi Diwas*, which set the tone for the year. The college continued its tradition of promoting knowledge and innovation with a two-day event on National Science Day, held on 27

and 28 February focusing on the theme "Indigenous Technologies for Viksit Bharat." This was followed by our vibrant Vasant Panchami celebrations on 14 February, a day of cultural renewal. A notable highlight was the "Mind Matters" conference held on 19 and 20 February, under the "Har Ghar Dhyam" initiative of the Government of India, promoting mental wellness. On 22 February, we proudly launched Project Amrit, a collaboration between NSS, Indraprastha College, and the Sant Nirankari Foundation, marking a significant contribution to societal welfare. The excitement continued with our Annual Sports Festival, "Tejas," held on 5 March, a day filled with energy, enthusiasm, and team spirit.

As the year progressed, April brought a series of impactful events. On World Health Day, 8 April, we organized a National Conference on "My Health, My Right," alongside a blood donation camp, reinforcing our commitment to community health. The Department of Multimedia, Mass Media, and Communication (MMMC) dazzled us with their annual festival, "Lights, Camera, Action," on 15 and 16 April. Our cultural calendar also included Shruti, the annual cultural festival, held with great grandeur on 18 and 19 April. In addition, the Rekhi Foundation conducted a faculty workshop on 22 April, focusing on enhancing pedagogical practices.

In May, the International Conference on Yoga, Yajna, and Ayurveda was held on the 3rd and 4th, celebrating ancient Indian wisdom and wellness practices. This was followed by the Millet Shakti Festival on 8 May and the "Anaemia Jaanch Shivir" in collaboration with Bhartiya Vikas Parishad on 10 May, reflecting our continued efforts in promoting health and awareness. On 5 June, World Environment Day was celebrated with the planting of saplings by the esteemed guests, faculty and students in the auspicious soil of Indraprastha College

As we moved into the latter part of the year, we witnessed more remarkable events, including an International Seminar on "Lok Ki Bhumika" on 1 and 2 August. The Independence Day celebrations on 15 August were a vibrant expression of patriotism, with kite flying at the college premises. Our engagement with Sanskrit and the Indian Knowledge System culminated in a National Seminar on 21 August, and the International Seminar on "Envisaging Bharat as the Voice of Global South" on 27 August, which brought together thought leaders from across India.

September saw the inauguration of the Happiness Research Centre on the 5th, with the launch of a Certificate Course on "Science and Practice of Happiness." We also hosted a memorable event

with Rashtra Kavi Gajendra Solanki on 13 September, who penned the Kulgeet of Delhi University, marking a historic moment. The month also witnessed the launch of a Certificate Course in Sanskrit Sambhashan on 17 September.

October continued to shine with the "Paripreksheya" festival on 16 and 17 October, celebrating 25 years of the MMMC Department. We also hosted a National Seminar on the Importance of Technical Terms in Social Sciences on October 21st and 22nd. November brought our Project Challenge on Road Safety on 13 November, as well as the inauguration of the Hindi Pathshala on 12 November, in collaboration with the Hindi Parshad (UK), to promote Hindi language and culture.

These events, each with its own distinct flair, have not only enriched our campus but also strengthened the bonds that make Indraprastha College a vibrant hub of learning, creativity, and community. As we look forward to the years ahead, let us continue to build on this legacy of excellence, inspiring future generations to reach new heights.

Indraprastha College for Women proudly presents its annual report, celebrating the outstanding academic achievements of its faculty. Over the past year, the faculty's dedication, innovative teaching methods, and scholarly pursuits have enriched the academic environment and made a significant impact on the wider academic community. The faculty's accomplishments include publishing in renowned journals, authoring books, presenting at conferences, and engaging in professional development programs. Many faculty members contributed to curriculum enhancement, secured grants, and received recognition for exceptional teaching. In the past year, six faculty members authored and edited books, while 39 contributed to nearly 75 research papers in prestigious journals. Four faculty members led significant research projects, fostering collaboration and academic contributions. Faculty members also participated in conferences, panel discussions, and professional development programs, ensuring the curriculum remained aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP). Several faculty members earned individual awards and recognitions, including four earning their Ph.D. degrees in 2024. These efforts reflect the faculty's commitment to academic excellence and advancement at Indraprastha College for Women.

The students of Indraprastha College continue to uphold the institution's reputation through their outstanding academic and extracurricular achievements, consistently earning recognition and

accolades. Their commitment to excellence has contributed to a legacy of success that reflects positively on the college. Below are some of the remarkable accomplishments of students across various departments. In the Psychology Department, Vasundhara Goyal (3rd Year) serves as the National Vice President of the Inclusive Education Skill Council (WICCI) and has presented research at notable conferences like IIM Bodhgaya and IIT Guwahati. Other students, such as Bidisha Dutta and Manasvi Pradhan, have also made valuable contributions to the field. The Geography Department shines with students like Shreya Aneja, who participated in the Niigata University Summer Program (Japan) and presented research at international conferences. Anjali Baghel and other students have contributed research on sustainability and urban hazards. In Political Science, students such as Disha Goyal and Jubli Das have earned international recognition, including attending programs at Niigata University and Harvard University. Similarly, the Economics Department has produced remarkable students like Maansi Aggarwal, who attended the London School of Economics Summer School. The Sociology Department has seen significant achievements, including Anusha Bhattacharya's internship at Jawaharlal Nehru University and success at various competitions. BAP students, like Ananya Vishnu and Amisha Haldar, have excelled in debates and competitions, adding to the department's prestige.

For the 2024-25 academic session, Indraprastha College for Women successfully enrolled a total of 1504 students across 16 undergraduate programs. Among these, 9 foreign students were admitted from countries such as Bangladesh, Cambodia, and Tibet. Additionally, the college saw 122 admissions in 10 postgraduate programs, further enhancing the diverse and vibrant academic community. Abiding by the policy of 'best interest of the student', the College respects the economic status of its students to the most possible extent. A total of 73 students have received Full waiver of the College Fee whereas Partial Fee waiver has been granted to a total of 294 students. Partial Fee waiver has been granted to 43 students residing in IP Hostel. Respecting the ethos of inclusive education, Full waiver of College Fee has been extended to all students admitted under PwBD category, who are 80 in number. This relaxation has also been granted in the Hostel Fee of 17 students with disability (PwBD students). I am happy to announce that a total of 193 students have received financial assistance from Government and other Agencies like NGOs and Trusts.

The annual college magazine, *Aaroh* 2024, continues its legacy of showcasing the brilliance that has thrived across generations on our campus grounds. Embracing the theme “*Timeless Traditions: Shaikshik Dharohar*,” this special edition commemorates a century of academic excellence and cultural evolution. From the vibrant campus tapestry and cherished traditions to visionary growth, the magazine features an array of poems, stories, articles celebrating the voices, achievements, and dreams that continue to shape our esteemed institution.

Through pioneering research, transformative pedagogical strategies, and active engagement in scholarly discourse, faculty members have continuously expanded the frontiers of knowledge and inspired students to excel. Their dedication to academic rigor, intellectual inquiry, and interdisciplinary collaboration has not only elevated the institution's reputation but also reinforced its role as a centre for thought leadership and innovation.

The faculty profile reflects an array of accomplishments, including publications in esteemed journals, book authorship, conference presentations, faculty development programs, curriculum enhancement, grant procurement, community engagement, and recognition for outstanding teaching and mentorship. Indraprastha College for Women extends its deepest appreciation to the faculty for their relentless pursuit of academic excellence, their role in fostering critical thinking, and their efforts in cultivating a culture of intellectual curiosity.

In the past academic session, 6 faculty members authored and edited numerous books, contributing to scholarly literature across various fields and enriching academic discourse with original research and critical insights. Additionally, 9 faculty members published significant chapters in edited volumes, offering specialized perspectives in their respective disciplines.

A remarkable 39 faculty members contributed to nearly 75 research papers in reputed academic journals, addressing pressing topics through rigorous analysis and evidence-based findings. Additionally, 10 faculty members published other literary works, such as news articles, translations, review articles, etc.

Furthermore, 4 faculty members led influential research initiatives such as ICSSR projects, the Journalism Education Trauma and Research Group (JETREG) International Project, and ICHR, fostering interdisciplinary collaboration and generating meaningful academic contributions.

Faculty engagement in knowledge dissemination extended to various platforms, with 47 faculty members presenting their research at international and national conferences, facilitating intellectual exchange and scholarly dialogue. More than 27 faculty members served as resource persons and invited speakers, sharing expertise and fostering academic discussions across diverse forums. Additionally, over 21 faculty members participated as chairpersons, discussants, or panelists, further contributing to academic discourse and guiding scholarly debates.

Professional development remained a key focus, with 49 faculty members attending faculty induction/ development programs aimed at enhancing pedagogical approaches and exploring innovative teaching methodologies. 13 faculty members participated in refresher courses to update their knowledge and skills, while 23 faculty members actively engaged in faculty induction training and orientation programs to refine their instructional strategies and professional competencies.

Moreover, 14 faculty members participated in HRD initiatives, faculty exchanges, staff training programs, and specialized seasonal schools, strengthening institutional collaborations and broadening academic expertise.

The faculty's commitment to curriculum development was evident, with 18 faculty members contributing to the revision and enhancement of academic programs in alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP). These efforts ensured the integration of contemporary perspectives and industry-aligned frameworks, reinforcing the interdisciplinary nature of the institution's curriculum.

Several faculty members also contributed to academic supervision and governance. Four faculty members are currently supervising PhD candidates. Faculty members take on roles such as coordinator/member of paper setting board, Delhi University, external practical examiner, guest/visiting faculty, and even guest of honour for a plethora of events in various different colleges. # DEPARTMENT ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

## COMMERCE

The Commerce Academic Society commenced the year 2024 with a workshop titled “Fundamentals of Investing in Capital Markets,” held in collaboration with the Central Depository Services Limited (CDSL) on 31 January 2024. The resource persons for the workshop were Shri Harbinder Singh Sokhi (CDSL) and CA Sachin Aggarwal. The session aimed to equip faculty members with foundational knowledge of the capital market and its core concepts, attracting about 50 participants. A similar workshop for non-faculty members was organized on 1 February 2024, also in collaboration with CDSL.

An online workshop on interview skills was conducted on 26 March 2024, led by Ms. Kalyani C., a Solution Architect at Marketing Phi with extensive experience. Over 100 attendees benefited from the session, which concluded with an engaging Q&A round. A 40-hour certification course on “Women in Data Program” was conducted offline by the Learning Links Foundation in collaboration with Dell Technologies, a CSR partner of Dell. Over 180 students registered for the program, which covered key topics such as Excel fundamentals, Pivot Tables, Lookup functions, VBA Macros, Power Query, Power BI, Python basics, and capstone projects. Students completing the course with project submissions became eligible for certification. On 18 March 2024, a student paper presentation competition was held with the theme “Viksit Bharat @2047.” Fourteen teams participated, sharing insightful research that enriched the audience’s understanding of India’s economic journey toward becoming a developed nation.

An online resume-building session was organized on 27 March 2024, in collaboration with Dell Technologies and the Learning Links Foundation. Approximately 70 enthusiastic students actively participated. As part of the annual fest Bizfiesta, a speaker session was held on 23 April 2024. The event featured Prof. A. K. Singh, Head and Dean of the Department of Commerce, University of Delhi, as the Chief Guest, along with guest speakers IAS Sonal Goel, TEDx speaker, and Mr. Sudhakaran S., Best Social Impact Influencer 2023. The session provided students with valuable knowledge and inspiration from the experiences of these distinguished speakers.

On 26 April 2024, various competitions such as Biz Brain (a commerce-related quiz), Ad-Venture, and Life Size Monopoly were organized as part of Bizfiesta. A talk on “Analysis of Union Budget

2024-25” was held on 21 August 2024, engaging over 150 students from various departments. The keynote speaker, Mr. Sidharth Rathore, Assistant Professor at Mata Sundri College for Women, University of Delhi, and Visiting Professor at LBSNAA, provided an in-depth analysis of the budget. A session on “Personal Branding” was conducted on 11 September 2024, by Dr. Upasana Dhanda, Assistant Professor at the International Management Institute, New Delhi. The session was highly informative, offering attendees tools to craft a strong personal brand and enhance their professional journey. The programs organized throughout the year stood as a testament to the association's commitment to fostering intellectual growth and camaraderie among students.

## **COMPUTER SCIENCE**

The Department of Computer Science at Indraprastha College for Women, in collaboration with the Department of Commerce, organized an event on 13 March 2024 titled "Inauguration of Semiconductor Technology by Hon'ble Prime Minister." This event highlighted the critical role of semiconductor technology in modern society and its transformative impact on various sectors. The initiative brought together experts, educators, and students to explore advancements and opportunities in the semiconductor domain. Discussions and presentations fostered awareness of the pivotal role semiconductors play in driving technological innovation. The collaborative efforts of the college departments underscored the institution's commitment to academic excellence and alignment with global technological advancements.

The Cybermeet Society of the Department of Computer Science organized a two-day workshop on PCB design on 3-4 April 2024. The workshop saw active participation from over 120 attendees, including faculty and students from various departments. The event focused on enhancing participants' understanding of Printed Circuit Board circuits, which are fundamental components in project development. The workshop provided hands-on experience and valuable insights into the practical applications of PCB technology, equipping participants with essential skills for academic and professional pursuits.

The Department of Computer Science organized VINCULUM'24, its annual inter-college tech fest, on the 16 and 17 April 2024, marking its return after seven years. With the theme "Tech Terror: An Intersection Between Technology and Crime," the fest explored the dynamic relationship between technological innovation and security. The festivities began with a grand

inauguration on 15 April in the AV Lecture Theater, featuring Dr. Murthy Remilla, Senior Scientist and ISRO Project Management Head, as the chief guest. Dr. Remilla shared insights on technology's evolving landscape. Major Goel's presence further elevated the event's significance. The two-day fest included competitions, food stalls, and a game zone on the college lawns, creating a blend of learning and enjoyment for participants and attendees.

The Department of Computer Science organized a panel discussion titled Technology for Tomorrow on 24 April and 2 May 2024. The event brought together students, faculty, and distinguished panelists to explore the transformative role of technology in shaping the future. Held under the guidance of the college principal, the session sparked meaningful conversations about innovation, sustainability, and the societal impact of technological advancements. The interactive discussion inspired participants, fostering a deeper understanding of the potential and challenges of technology in a rapidly evolving world.

The Department of Computer Science hosted a workshop on Data Science on 2 May 2024. The session, attended by 112 students and 10 faculty members, aimed to equip participants with practical knowledge and hands-on experience in this rapidly growing field. Rohit Pahwa, a Data Scientist from DUCAT, conducted the workshop. His expertise provided attendees with insights into the applications and trends of Data Science, fostering a deeper understanding of its real-world significance and career prospects.

The Department of Computer Science organized an Alumna Talk titled Empowering Voices: AI-Driven Speech Processing for Accessibility and Inclusion on 4 September 2024. The session, inaugurated by Dr. Manoj Kumar, featured Pooja Gambhir, an alumna, who shared her expertise on how AI is revolutionizing accessibility for individuals with disabilities. Key topics included advancements in AI tools like BharatGPT, Microsoft Copilot, and Google Bard; Google's speech-to-text technology; robotic assistants in education and workplaces; AI applications in healthcare; and innovations in language conversion systems and assistive tools for the visually impaired. The talk concluded with a Q&A session and networking, inspiring attendees to explore AI's potential for societal transformation.

The Cybermeet Society of the Department of Computer Science organized the First Year Orientation for Batch 2024–2028 on 29th August 2024 in Room G1. Faculty members and society

representatives attended the session, which began with an introduction to the National Education Policy by Teacher-in-Charge Dr. Manoj Kumar and Faculty Member Harendra Pratap. They provided a comprehensive overview of the NEP framework and outlined the first-semester subjects, including DSE, VAC, SEC, and AEC. Meha Yadav, the Student Representative of the Event Vertical, introduced the Cybermeet Society members, explained the society's structure and benefits, and elaborated on the eligibility criteria for joining, such as 75 percent attendance, no backlogs, and active participation in departmental activities. She also highlighted the society's initiatives, including workshops, paper presentations, and competitions. The orientation concluded with a brief overview of upcoming events and opportunities for student engagement.

The Cybermeet Society of the Department of Computer Science organized the Freshers'24 Welcome event on 25th October 2024 at the College Translation Center. The event began with a ramp walk, where new students received titles and welcome gifts from seniors. The celebration continued with musical performances and comic skits by second- and third-year students. Faculty members also joined in with a special ramp walk, followed by a nostalgic video montage of past college memories. The event concluded with a vibrant celebration, marking the start of the new academic year for the 2024 batch.

## **ECONOMICS**

In February 2024, the Economics Department organized a seminar on "The State of the Indian Economy" on 28 February 2024, under the guidance of IQAC coordinator, Prof. Roopali Goyanka. The guest speaker for the session was Dr. Arvind Virmani, an Indian macroeconomist, former Chief Economic Advisor of India, and a member of Niti Aayog. The session was attended by teachers and students from various departments across all three years. The event was inaugurated by Prof. Poonam Kumria, the principal, who felicitated Dr. Virmani and lit the lamp alongside other dignitaries. The seminar focused on India's economic past and present, highlighting the distinction between the Planning Commission and Niti Aayog. Dr. Virmani introduced the concept of the "Indic Market Economy," emphasizing the role of private sector and NGOs in empowering people and promoting welfare. He reinforced the importance of sustained, fast, and inclusive growth in achieving India's goal of becoming a high-income country by 2047. The session also marked the launch of the 10th volume of the annual academic journal *Prophets of Profit* for 2022-

23, which focused on the theme "Development in South Asia." The journal contains academic articles, review papers, and research papers contributing to the field of economics.

In March 2024, the department organized a workshop on "Research Paper Review" on 18 March 2024, conducted by Ms. Gargee Sarkar. The workshop provided valuable insights into the essential components of a research paper and the importance of accessing published journals. Ms. Sarkar explained the structural elements of a research paper and guided participants on reputable platforms for accessing scholarly resources, helping them navigate the academic landscape with confidence.

In April 2024, the department hosted an Inter-University Debate Competition on 8 April 2024, with the theme "The Future of Automation and AI on the Labor Market." The competition featured five teams, each consisting of two participants. The debate provided a platform for insightful discussions on the transformative impact of automation and AI on the labor market. Participants presented diverse perspectives on the topic, acknowledging the benefits of technological advancements while emphasizing the need for proactive measures to ensure inclusive prosperity.

On 1 April 2024, the department conducted a group discussion on "Education vs. Experience," focusing on the dynamic relationship between academic qualifications and practical experience in the job market. The discussion provided valuable insights into optimizing the division of labor and enhancing employability by recognizing the complementary roles of education and experience.

On 15 April 2024, the department organized a special movie screening of *The Pursuit of Happyness*, directed by Gabriele Muccino and starring Will Smith. The screening aimed to spark discussions on perseverance and the pursuit of one's dreams, fostering a sense of solidarity, empathy, and optimism among the attendees.

On 29 April 2024, the department conducted its much-awaited Annual Academic Department Festival, Arthullas'24, under the support of the principal, Prof. Poonam Kumria, and organized by the Academic Advisor, Ms. Gargee Sarkar, along with Co-advisors Ms. Shravasti Soni and Mr. Shashwat Pandey. The festival, attended by 300 participants, featured a keynote lecture by Ms. Mannat Sharma, Senior Research Head at Nikore Associates and Consultant at the World Bank Group. The lecture focused on the care economy and the economic value of women's unpaid work.

The festival also included stimulating competitive events such as an economics-based treasure hunt, trivia, and innovation-based competitions.

On 6 May 2024, the department organized the "Department Annual Day" for the final-year students, celebrating their achievements. The event included the presentation of medals and certificates, with faculties offering lasting guidance for life. First and second-year students organized nostalgic memorabilia and events for the final-year students.

In August 2024, the department conducted a Group Discussion activity on "Indian Economy since Independence: Unravelling the Development Strategy" on 14 August 2024. The discussion was moderated by Academic Advisor, Ms. Sujayata Choudhry, and involved around 45 students. The group discussion focused on the agricultural and industrial sectors of India, providing a comprehensive overview of India's economic development strategies since independence. The event highlighted the historical and contemporary challenges and achievements in the agricultural sector, while also discussing the industrial sector's growth and the impact of a mixed economy.

On 29 August 2024, the department organized an Orientation Event for the incoming batch of first-year students. The event aimed to familiarize the new students with the college environment, introduce them to the faculty members, and provide an overview of the structure of the Economics program. The event featured a welcome address by Ms. Shravasti Soni, the Teacher-in-Charge, followed by a presentation on the Economics program and extracurricular opportunities available to students. The session also introduced students to "Arthagya," the Economics Association, and the annual academic journal *Prophets of Profit*. Students were encouraged to participate in the department's activities and submit entries for the journal.

On 4 September 2024, the department organized an "Alumna Talk cum Distinguished Lecture" attended by 114 students. The session featured Dr. Reetika Garg, an alumna of the department, who shared her academic and professional journey. Dr. Garg's talk focused on "Time Series Analysis" and its importance in economic forecasting and modeling. The event provided deep insights into the field of economics and allowed students to learn from the experiences of a distinguished alumna.

On 25 October 2024, the department hosted the Fresher's event at the lawns near the Philosophy Department. On 6 November 2024, the department organized a session on "The Role of Behavioral Economics in Policy Making." The event aimed to explore how behavioral economics can influence policy decisions, offering a new perspective on the intersection between psychology and economics. The session featured Dr. Ananya Sharma, a renowned expert in behavioral economics, who shared her research and insights into how understanding human behavior can improve economic policies and outcomes. Dr. Sharma discussed various behavioral biases that affect decision-making and provided examples of how governments can use this knowledge to design more effective policies, particularly in areas like health, education, and finance.

On 12 November 2024, the department organized a workshop on "Data Analysis and Economic Modeling" aimed at equipping students with practical skills in data analysis using statistical software. The workshop, conducted by Mr. Rajesh Kumar, a data scientist with extensive experience in economic modeling, provided hands-on training in using tools like Excel, SPSS, and Stata for economic data analysis. Participants were guided through the process of collecting, cleaning, and analyzing data, as well as interpreting the results to draw meaningful conclusions for economic research.

On 20 November 2024, the department organized a guest lecture on "The Future of Sustainable Development in India." The lecture, delivered by Dr. Ramesh Kumar, a leading environmental economist, focused on the challenges and opportunities related to sustainable development in India. Dr. Kumar emphasized the importance of balancing economic growth with environmental protection and discussed various policies and initiatives aimed at promoting sustainability in the country. In December 2024, the department held its annual cultural and academic event, "EconFest." The event was a celebration of the department's achievements over the year and featured a variety of activities, including academic presentations, cultural performances, and a talent showcase.

Overall, the events organized by the Economics Association of the Department of Economics at Indraprastha College for Women from January to December 2024 contributed significantly to the academic and personal development of students.

## ENGLISH

"Celebrating Women in Bhartiya Itihasa" marked International Women's Day on 6 March featuring a lecture series highlighting women's roles in Indian history and literature. "Quixlit Quest: A Quiz Competition on Literature" occurred on 18 March 2024, organized by the English Literary Society. "Rangotsav," on 20 March explored eco-friendly ways to celebrate Holi, emphasizing sustainability and expression. "LitLens: An Intra-College Picture Composition Competition" was held on 1 April 2024. A "Book Donation Drive" took place on 3 April 2024 facilitated exchanges among students and faculty, fostering a culture of sharing knowledge within the college community. Coordinated by faculty members and volunteers, the drive collected books for the student community, contributing to a vibrant literary environment.

Navigating Odia Folklore: The English Literary Society at Indraprastha College for Women organized a special event in line with the directives outlined in the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, aimed at promoting Indian literature and languages. The session featured distinguished speaker, Prof Saroj K Mahananda, a renowned author, translator, and Professor at the Department of English, Jamia Millia Islamia. Prof Mahananda's discourse was captivating as he navigated through the depths of Odia folklore, unravelling its hidden gems and shedding light on its cultural significance.

An intra-college Biannual Young Researchers' Meet was organized on 22 April from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM on the theme of Green Pages: Rethinking Nature, Environment, and Literature. The English Literary Society organized the annual Kamath Literary Award: Intra-college Essay Writing Competition on 24 April 2024. Yashika Sharma (B.A. (H) English, Sem II) won the Kamath Literary Award. The Annual Literary Fest, Udbhav, was celebrated on 30 April 2024. As a part of the fest, an Intra-College Conference on the Theme of Green Pages - Rethinking Nature, Environment and Literature was also organized.

An orientation session for M.A. English Semester III students was conducted to provide essential information about the semester's academic and other related responsibilities. Students were encouraged to use the library and other academic facilities available on college campus. On 25 October 2024, the English Department held its annual Freshers' Day celebration. The Department

of English organized a CUET (PG) English Crash Course for third-year B.A. (Hons) English students from 25 to 29 November 2024.

## **ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES**

On 2 February 2024, in celebration of World Wetland Day, a field visit to Yamuna Biodiversity Park was organized, involving four faculty members and twenty-seven students. The purpose of the visit was to enhance awareness and understanding of wetland ecosystems and their significance. The visit was made possible with the unwavering support of our Principal, Prof. Poonam Kumria, whose dedication to environmental initiatives is truly commendable. Students were thrilled to observe various plant species, many of which are native to the region and play a crucial role in maintaining ecological balance. Among the flora, notable species included the sacred lotus (*Nelumbo nucifera*), water hyacinth (*Eichhornia crassipes*), and bulrushes (*Typha* spp.), which are vital for the habitat's health. The park also showcased its constructed wetlands designed to provide natural conditions and support local biodiversity.

On 20 March 2024, a talk on the importance of house sparrows was conducted by Dr. Nawin K Tiwary, followed by a nature trail where students observed sparrows and other bird species. Students pledged to protect house sparrows and other avifaunal species in their environment.

On 21 March 2024, Shri Jitesh Kumar, Assistant Commissioner from the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change delivered a lecture highlighting Bharat's rich forest cover and its status as one of the World's 18 mega biodiverse regions. The celebration aimed to raise awareness about the importance of trees and forests.

On 8 April 2024, the Department of Environmental Studies organized a field visit to Asita Park for students. This visit, supported by our dedicated Principal, Prof. Poonam Kumria, aimed to deepen students' understanding of wetland ecosystems and involved five faculty members and twenty-five students. The group embarked on an engaging nature trail, where students observed various native plant species such as Pond lily, Cattails, and Sedges, learning about their importance in maintaining ecological balance. Students also had the opportunity to collect water quality data using Hanna Instruments, gaining hands-on experience in environmental monitoring.

The department's inaugural annual fest, 'Praakrit,' held on 30 April 2024, was a blend of enlightenment and action. It featured expert talks on 'Understanding Nature,' impactful street plays on single-use plastic, a movie screening, and various engaging competitions, leaving participants motivated and empowered to make a difference.

The World Environment Day celebration at Indraprastha College for Women on 5 June 2024 was a vibrant and inspiring event dedicated to the theme of 'Land Restoration, Desertification, and Drought Resilience.' The program featured enlightening speeches by the Principal, Prof. Poonam Kumria, and the Chief Guest, Prof. Shri Prakash Singh, who emphasized the importance of environmental sustainability and cultural practices tied to nature. A plantation drive marked the highlight of the event, with participants planting a variety of fruit-bearing trees to enhance campus biodiversity. The celebration demonstrated the college's steadfast commitment to fostering a sustainable and eco-conscious campus community.

On 4 September 2024, the Department of Environmental Studies and the Department of Sociology, in collaboration with Bhartiya Shikshan Mandal, North Delhi, Yuva Aayam, successfully hosted an insightful talk titled "From Draft to Publication: Elevate Your Research for Impact and Success" for over 60 students. Led by Professor Rajesh, Nodal Officer of the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan at the University of Delhi, the session covered essential aspects of research and publication, including selecting impactful topics, crafting a compelling abstract, developing a strong paper structure, ensuring academic integrity, and navigating the peer-review process. The interactive Q&A session addressed various concerns, such as overcoming writer's block and time management, leaving students motivated and confident, praising the session for significantly enhancing their research and publication skills.

World Ozone Day 2024, themed "Montreal Protocol: Advancing Climate Actions," was celebrated on 25 September. This annual event, established by the United Nations in 1994, emphasizes the importance of international collaboration in addressing environmental challenges and highlights the critical role of the ozone layer in protecting life on Earth by absorbing harmful ultraviolet radiation. The celebration included a movie screening on the ozone layer, student presentations with 20 participants, and a poster-making competition with 11 participants. The program not only raised awareness about the need to protect the ozone layer but also provided students with

opportunities to enhance their knowledge of environmental issues, develop presentation and artistic skills, and foster a sense of responsibility toward global climate action.

On 25 September 2024, the Department of Environmental Studies organized a successful Wastepaper Collection Drive with the participation of about 50 students. The event, aimed at reducing paper waste and promoting recycling, saw wastepaper, including used notebooks, old records, and discarded files, being collected from various areas of the campus, with faculty, staff, and students actively participating in the segregation and collection process. Principal Prof. Poonam Kumria praised the efforts of all involved, encouraging sustainable practices on campus and beyond. The collected paper was sent for recycling, raising awareness about the importance of responsible consumption and waste reduction.

On 9 October 2024, six students from the Department of Environmental Studies, accompanied by faculty members, visited the Yamuna Biodiversity Park (YBP) to participate in a Butterfly Assessment event organized for Wildlife Week. The event aimed to raise awareness about biodiversity and provide hands-on experience in butterfly identification. Participants were guided to identify various species through a nature trail led by butterfly experts. The visit enhanced students' practical knowledge, supporting the ongoing Biodiversity Assessment at the college, and strengthened the department's collaboration with YBP for future biodiversity research.

On 24 October 2024, the Department of Environmental Studies at Indraprastha College for Women hosted an enlightening talk by Prof. Dr. Snehal Donde, a renowned expert in river rejuvenation and water conservation. The session, titled "Creating Stewardship for Clean and Healthy Rivers," focused on the urgent need for sustainable river conservation practices, particularly in India, and emphasized the importance of community involvement in addressing water crises. Dr. Donde highlighted the multidisciplinary nature of environmental studies and encouraged students from all backgrounds to contribute to water conservation efforts. She discussed the revival of rivers like the Ganga and Yamuna, the impact of pollutants on river health, and the role of youth, especially women, in driving change.

## **GEOGRAPHY**

In 2024, the Department of Geography at IPCW organized an extensive array of events, seminars, and field trips that fostered academic exploration, cultural engagement, and experiential learning.

The international seminar "Envisaging the Role of Bharat as the Voice of Global South" (27-28 August) focused on Bharat's leadership in climate action, hosting over 450 participants who discussed climate resilience, eco-restoration, and sustainable development. Similarly, the National Exhibition on Mission LiFE (9-10 February) emphasized sustainable practices, with students excelling in competitions and interacting with various organizations.

Women's contributions to urban development were explored during the event "Women and Its Role in Transforming the Landscape of New India @ 2047" (19 March), where Smt. Kalpana Sharma highlighted women-led initiatives. The Annual GeoFest (25 April) celebrated geography's connection to sustainability through competitions like Geo-Shark Tank, cultural performances, and an MoU with the Centre for Himalayan Studies. A special lecture on disaster resilience in Sikkim (4 April) by Prof. Vinod Sharma emphasized practical disaster management strategies, especially in the context of the Sendai Framework.

Field excursions offered hands-on learning experiences. Students visited Sikkim (6- 14 April) to assess disaster risks, engaging with local authorities and communities to study multi-hazard vulnerability. Similarly, the Gujarat trip (22-28 October) provided insights into industrial development, environmental impacts, and government policies, featuring visits to major industrial sites and discussions with policymakers.

Other academic highlights included the International Conference on Green Hydrogen (12 September), focusing on India's progress in renewable energy and its global collaborations, and a workshop on road safety (13 November) that addressed women's safety and first aid training. The department also celebrated World Philosophy Day and hosted special events like the National Press Day (16 November), where students interacted with media professionals on issues of misinformation and digital literacy.

Each event reflected the department's commitment to integrating academic knowledge with real-world applications, fostering students' critical thinking, and promoting interdisciplinary learning. Through these initiatives, students gained a deeper understanding of geography's role in addressing global challenges, from climate change and disaster resilience to urban development and industrial growth. The department's dedication to experiential learning, collaboration, and innovation ensured that 2024 was a transformative year for its students and faculty alike.

## हिंदी विभाग

हिंदी विभाग की अकादमिक समिति "साहित्य सभा" के अंतर्गत वर्ष 2024 में अनेक कार्यक्रमों का आयोजन किया गया। "साहित्य सभा" छात्राओं को एक ऐसा मंच प्रदान करती है जिसमें उन्हें अपनी विविधमुखी प्रतिभाओं को निखारने का अवसर प्राप्त होता है। इसमें कविता प्रतियोगिता, नाट्य प्रतियोगिता, विविध कार्यशालाएं, संगोष्ठियाँ इत्यादि शामिल हैं।

"साहित्य सभा" ने दिनांक 12 जनवरी 2024 को गिरिजा कुमार माथुर कविता प्रतियोगिता का आयोजन किया जिसमें महाविद्यालय की छात्राओं ने बढ़चढ़ कर भागीदारी की और अपने भावों को कविता के रूप में प्रस्तुत किया। 18 मार्च 2024 "लोक चित्रकला और लोकगीतों में भारत बोध" विषय पर अंतर महाविद्यालय स्तर पर प्रतियोगिता संपन्न हुई। इसी क्रम में आगे दिनांक 30 अप्रैल 2024 को गीता गंजू नाटक प्रतियोगिता का आयोजन किया गया जिसमें छात्राओं ने विभिन्न नाटकों का उत्साहवर्धक मंचन किया। दिनांक 30 अप्रैल 2024 को "अभ्युदय" (विभाग का वार्षिक समारोह) का आयोजन किया गया। इसके अंतर्गत विभिन्न प्रतियोगिताएं जैसे मोनो एक्ट प्रतियोगिता, त्वरित चित्रकला प्रतियोगिता संपन्न हुई। इसी के अंतर्गत आर्ट और क्राफ्ट कार्निवल का भी आयोजन हुआ।

अगस्त माह में दिनांक 1 और 2 अगस्त 2024 को आईसीएचआर के संयुक्त तत्वावधान में दो दिवसीय अंतरराष्ट्रीय संगोष्ठी का आयोजन किया गया जिसमें देश विदेश के विद्वानों ने भागीदारी की। दिनांक 13 सितंबर 2024 को हिंदी दिवस कार्यक्रम बड़ी धूमधाम से संपन्न किया गया। अंत में दिनांक 21 सितंबर 2024 को कहानी प्रतियोगिता एवं कविता प्रतियोगिता सफलतापूर्वक संपन्न हुई।

हिंदी विभाग द्वारा संपन्न इन विविध कार्यक्रमों के माध्यम से कई प्रतिभाएं निखर कर सामने आईं। विभाग द्वारा आयोजित होने वाले कार्यक्रमों में छात्राओं की भागीदारी अत्यंत उत्साहवर्धक रही।

## HISTORY

In 2024, the History Department at Indraprastha College for Women organized a range of academic and cultural activities that deepened students' understanding of history, culture, and heritage. On 15 March, a lecture by Dr. Vedveer Arya explored the chronology of Indian civilization, challenging conventional narratives and engaging over 500 students in a thought-provoking Q&A session. On 4 April, a poster-making competition themed "Gandhi and Satyagraha" celebrated Gandhian values, with students showcasing their creativity, and the winners being honored by Principal Prof. Poonam Kumria.

Field trips enriched experiential learning throughout the year. On 20 March, Semester II and IV students visited the National Museum to explore artifact collections and exhibition techniques. On April 6, first-year students visited Lal Quila, or the Red Fort, learning about its Mughal architecture and historical significance under the guidance of faculty. An immersive visit to the Partition Museum on 10 April provided insights into India's Partition, with sessions on oral history and guided tours of the Dara Shukoh Garden. Competitions celebrated heritage and creativity. A photography competition on April 8, themed "Through the Lens: Heritage of Delhi," showcased students' talent, with winning entries exhibited. On 9 April, a lecture by Prof. K.P. Singh connected Gandhian values to sustainable development, emphasizing the importance of indigenous ethics and character.

A second visit to the museum on October 24 allowed students to engage with India's rich heritage through interactive activities and diverse galleries. As well as a highlight of the year was a visit to Humayun's Tomb and its museum on October 24. Students explored its architectural features, including the Charbagh gardens, double dome structure, and Persian-inspired design. The museum offered insights into Mughal culture through artifacts, manuscripts, and restoration displays. Faculty guided students through the conservation efforts led by the Aga Khan Trust for Culture, which revived the tomb's original grandeur.

These activities provided students with a comprehensive academic experience, combining lectures, competitions, and field trips to foster appreciation for historical and cultural heritage. The department's initiatives emphasized immersive learning and underscored the importance of conservation, creativity, and academic inquiry.

## **MATHEMATICS**

From January to December 2024, TRIJYA, the Mathematics Academic Society at Indraprastha College for Women, organized a series of academic and cultural events showcasing creativity, community spirit, and intellectual engagement. On 5 March, the Mathematics Department's March Past Team secured first place during the college's Annual Sports Day. Pi Day was celebrated on 14 March with a lecture by Prof. Ayub Khan of Jamia Millia Islamia, followed by a mathematical quiz fostering collaboration among nine student teams. A movie screening of *A Beautiful Mind* on March 18 delved into John Nash's mathematical genius and struggles with mental health, sparking

reflective discussions. On 1 April, a Mathematical Rangoli Competition themed “Viksit Bharat @ 2047” combined mathematics with art, fostering teamwork and creativity.

The department hosted a workshop on Statistical Software R on 3 & 4 April, led by Prof. Satish Verma, providing students hands-on learning. A lecture series commenced on April 8 with a session by Prof. Gopal Dutt on the application of real analysis in social sciences. Career guidance followed on 15 April with a seminar by Mr. Navneet Anand, focusing on MBA opportunities post-graduation. Paridhi 2024, held on 16 April, featured paper presentations, Sudoku, and a lively mela with games and food stalls, fostering community engagement. Subsequent lectures included Prof. Sanjay Pant’s session on proof (22 April) and Prof. S. Sivaprasad Kumar’s talk on counterexamples in real analysis (25 April). The semester concluded with a farewell for the graduating batch on 2 May, highlighted by cultural performances and a fashion show.

During the odd semester, TRIJYA continued its initiatives with an alumna interaction on 14 August, where Jaya Sharma shared her UPSC journey, inspiring students. Teacher’s Day on 5 September was celebrated with gratitude-filled activities honoring faculty members. On 25 October, a Fresher’s Welcome introduced the new Mathematics Hons. batch through games and competitions, with Ms. Suhana winning the title. The year concluded with preparations for student paper presentations on December 20 to celebrate National Mathematics Day, commemorating Srinivasa Ramanujan.

These activities emphasized TRIJYA’s commitment to blending academic rigor with cultural vibrancy, creating a holistic environment that encouraged intellectual growth, skill-building, and community participation. The diverse events highlighted the society’s dedication to fostering mathematical understanding while nurturing creativity and camaraderie among students and faculty.

## **MULTI MEDIA AND MASS COMMUNICATION**

In 2024, the Department of Multi Media and Mass Communication (MMMC) at Indraprastha College for Women organized a range of impactful workshops, field visits, and events to enhance students’ practical skills and theoretical understanding in media and communication. The year began with a workshop on Development Communication and Social Change (February 21), where

senior journalist Muni Shankar Pandey shared his experiences addressing vaccine hesitancy in rural areas, offering insights into effective community engagement strategies. A Travelogue Making Workshop (28 February) with travel blogger Umesh Pant explored the art of travel writing, emphasizing research and storytelling.

Dr. Archana Kumari conducted a Climate Change Verification Workshop (4 March) in collaboration with Google News Initiative, focusing on combating misinformation in climate reporting. On March 6, students visited the Indian Urban Observatory, engaging with policymakers like Hardeep Singh Puri and IAS officer Rajiv Jain on urban planning. A Filmmaking Workshop (12-14 March) introduced students to direction, cinematography, and post-production, culminating in student-led projects. The department celebrated its 25th anniversary with the Annual Media Festival (15 April), featuring competitions, guest lectures, and awards.

Ethics and Regulations in Media were highlighted in a workshop by advocate Kanika Bhardwaj (4 September), discussing ethical journalism and its societal role. Dr. Sonam Puri hosted a Podcast Workshop (11 September), emphasizing podcasting as a career, covering scripting, monetization, and audience engagement. The International Film Festival, *Pariprekshya* (16-17 October), showcased diverse films and featured masterclasses by renowned filmmakers like Ravi Kishan and Aseem Mishra. Events like the Halloween-themed Freshers Party (October 25) and National Press Day (16 November) further enriched the student experience.

Field visits included a Filmmaking Workshop at Shivaji College (28 November) and the Jagran Film Festival (5-6 December), where students critiqued films and participated in smartphone filmmaking workshops. The year concluded with "The Ultimate Paint Off" (6 December), fostering discussions on the "One Nation, One Election" initiative through creative activities.

These initiatives reflect the department's commitment to blending experiential learning with creative expression, preparing students to navigate the evolving media landscape. By hosting diverse activities and industry collaborations, MMMC provided a platform for skill development, community engagement, and professional growth, fostering the next generation of media professionals.

## **PHILOSOPHY**

In 2024, the Department of Philosophy at Indraprastha College for Women organized an impressive array of events that combined academic, cultural, and interactive elements to foster intellectual growth and community engagement. On 18 March, an inter-college poster-making competition on "The Art of Happiness" encouraged students to creatively explore happiness through philosophical, psychological, and spiritual lenses. This was followed by a Research Writing Workshop on 19 March, where Dr. Reetu Jaiswal provided insights into research methodology and proposal writing. On 3 April, a trip to the National Gallery of Modern Art enriched students' understanding of aesthetics through experiential learning.

The department hosted a Student Paper Presentation on 22 April, where 11 teams explored the theme "Viksit Bharat through the lens of Philosophy," providing critical analyses and receiving valuable feedback. The Annual Day celebration, Manthan, on May 1 featured cultural performances, including a play on the Mahabharata, and recognized students' academic achievements. An alumna interaction on 7 August saw UPSC achiever Shubra Panda share her philosophical inspirations and civil services journey.

Workshops and lectures continued with a session on "How to Choose a Research Topic" by Prof. Devika Sangwan on 21 August, emphasizing the importance of curiosity and goal-oriented research. On 5 September, the Dr. Radhakrishnan Memorial Lecture by Prof. Balaganapathi Devarakonda explored the decolonization of Indian knowledge systems, engaging the audience in discussions on Indian philosophy.

A National Seminar on "Bhāratīya Mūlyabōdha" on 13 November brought together distinguished scholars to discuss the relevance of Indian values such as Dharma, Satya, and Karma Yoga in addressing contemporary challenges. Talks explored topics like peace, Indian traditions, and value theory. World Philosophy Day on 21 November featured a talk on "The Role of Philosophy in Health and Being," where Dr. Manasvini Yogi highlighted the contributions of Indian philosophical schools to well-being and societal issues.

These diverse activities demonstrated the department's dedication to blending academic rigor with cultural enrichment, providing students and faculty with opportunities to engage deeply with

philosophical thought, explore its practical applications, and foster a strong sense of community. The events celebrated Indian philosophy while addressing modern-day issues, creating a platform for intellectual exploration and meaningful dialogue.

## **POLITICAL SCIENCE**

Over the past year, the department has organized a diverse array of events designed to foster academic growth, cultural expression, and social awareness among students. In March 2024, the department conducted an insightful project findings dissemination workshop, focusing on an ICSSR-funded study conducted by our own faculty members that assessed the socio-economic impact of the scheme that examined public awareness, reach, and employment opportunities. In the same month, the Mera Pehla Vote Desh Ke Liye initiative engaged students in democratic processes through a series of competitions like quizzes, poster-making, open mics, and slogan writing, encouraging a deeper understanding of electoral participation. The months that followed were equally dynamic, with April featuring a Constitution Reading Event, where students read the Indian Constitution in regional languages, and a visit to the Gandhi Smriti and Darshan Samiti for a field trip that delved into the life and ideals of Mahatma Gandhi. The department also hosted an Alumna Talk with IAS officer Pari Bishnoi, offering valuable career insights and inspiration for students aspiring to enter the civil services. May 2024 marked a celebration of student talent during Namastute, the Annual Department Fest, alongside a heartfelt Farewell event for third-year students. The year continued with an Orientation Day in August, guiding incoming students through academic and extracurricular opportunities, followed by an Alumna Talk with Shreya Mann in September, where the successful CDS exam candidate shared strategies for cracking competitive exams. The latter part of the year saw key events such as the Freshers Event in October, designed to welcome and integrate the new batch of students into campus life. In November 2024, the department concluded the year with a National Conference on the Indian Constitution in collaboration with the Dr. Ambedkar International Centre (DAIC), which brought together scholars and experts to discuss the evolving impact of the Constitution on Indian society and institutions. This series of events not only enriched students' academic experience but also provided them with opportunities for personal growth, professional development, and a deeper connection to India's democratic and cultural legacy.

## **PSYCHOLOGY**

The Department of Psychology at Indraprastha College for Women demonstrated remarkable dedication to fostering holistic development and academic enrichment throughout 2024. A standout initiative was the inter-department open-mic event, "The Social Media Mind," held on April 1 under the aegis of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). This event invited participants to share their experiences regarding social media's influence on mental health, self-image, relationships, and identity. Judged by Dr. Swati Jain and Ms. Tanushree, the event celebrated students' creativity and critical engagement with the digital world, culminating in awards for Ms. Shubhangi Semwal and Ms. Sanvi Rastogi. In March, the department organized a workshop titled "Who's Running Your Life? You or Your Monkey Brain?" Facilitated by Dr. Satender Rekhi Singh, the session provided over 300 attendees with insights into prioritizing happiness and emotional regulation. Combining informal interaction with relatable real-life examples, the workshop encouraged critical self-reflection and empowered participants to overcome challenges posed by the "monkey brain." This session epitomized the department's commitment to student wellbeing, blending science with practical approaches to happiness. From 29 February to 3 March, the department undertook an educational trip to Dev Sanskriti Vishwavidyalaya in Haridwar. Students gained firsthand experience of indigenous psychology, including meditation, sound healing, and the Vedic lifestyle. This immersive journey exposed students to the principles of Positive Psychology through lectures and experiential activities like Yoga Nidra and Yagna ceremonies. The integration of academic concepts with spiritual practices provided a transformative learning experience, enhancing their appreciation for India's psychological traditions. Another noteworthy event was the screening of *A Beautiful Mind* on 21 August, where students engaged with the complex portrayal of schizophrenia. Discussions before and after the film explored themes of mental health, societal stigma, and coping mechanisms, encouraging empathy and deeper understanding. Similarly, on 5 September, the department celebrated Teacher's Day with vibrant activities like mimicry, a ramp walk, and a jamming session. These events reinforced the bond between students and faculty, fostering an environment of mutual respect and joy. The Fresher's Day event, held on 25 October, 2024, brought the theme "Villains vs. Heroes" to life through dynamic performances, engaging activities, and a high-energy DJ session. The celebration provided an exciting platform for newcomers to bond, showcasing creativity and camaraderie among students. The academic calendar concluded with thought-

provoking initiatives such as the Media Psychology talk by Professor Navin Kumar on 27 November. The session explored the impact of media and AI on identity, offering valuable perspectives on navigating the digital age. Throughout the year, the department consistently provided platforms for intellectual growth, emotional exploration, and cultural engagement, reflecting its dedication to empowering students in diverse and meaningful ways.

## **SANSKRIT**

The Sanskrit Department of Indraprastha College for Women proudly organized and participated in various cultural, academic, and educational events in 2024, marking a year of significant achievements. The year commenced with the broadcast of "Shri Ram Prana Pratishtha Song" on DD News, presented by our students, followed by the consecration of Lord Ram's statue on 22 January. These initiatives celebrated the inauguration of the Shri Ram Temple and showcased the talents of our students through devotional performances. On 7 February, the college celebrated its centenary year with Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar as the chief guest. The Sanskrit department contributed through Swasti Vachan and bilingual anchoring, reflecting cultural richness and unity. Subsequently, Saraswati Puja was observed on Basant Panchami (14 February), where students performed devotional songs, blending tradition and reverence. March witnessed a series of intellectually stimulating events, including a lecture on Sahitya-Sampraday (13 March) and an educational trip to Haridwar (19-20 March). The trip offered students insights into Gurukul traditions, enriching their understanding of Sanskrit heritage. A special lecture on "Karan-Karak-Prakran-Sampraday" (2 May) further deepened academic engagement, with students excelling in various activities and being recognized for their achievements. Sanskrit Day (21 August) brought a national seminar on Indian Knowledge Traditions, graced by distinguished scholars, including Prof. Srinivas Vankhde and Dr. Priyakan Mishra. The thought-provoking discussions on Indian philosophy versus Western paradigms inspired students and faculty alike. The year concluded with the Sanskrit Sambhashan program (9 October), marking the culmination of a spoken Sanskrit course in collaboration with Sanskrit Bharati. Students showcased their linguistic prowess through skits, Abhinay Geet, and heartfelt testimonials. Certificates were distributed, and the event highlighted Sanskrit as a bridge between language and culture. Throughout these events, the unwavering support of the faculty, led by Principal Prof. Poonam Kumria, and the enthusiastic participation of students ensured success. These initiatives underscored the department's

commitment to preserving and promoting Sanskrit, fostering both cultural pride and academic excellence.

## **SOCIOLOGY**

The Department of Sociology organized a series of impactful events throughout 2024, enriching academic discourse and student engagement. On 22 April, the department hosted the “Screening of the Ethnographic film No City for Women by the GendV Project”, University of Cambridge, followed by a discussion led by Dr. Garima Jaju, a Post-Doctoral Research Associate. Students explored themes such as gender sociology, urbanization, and ethnographic methods, delving into both academic and personal narratives about city life. On 4 May, students enrolled in the “Visual Culture course visited the National Gallery of Modern Art (NGMA)”. Guided by Assistant Curator Mr. Kamal Mitra, participants engaged with over 17,000 works by iconic artists, including Raja Ravi Verma and Amrita Sher-Gil. The visit prompted vibrant discussions on museology, inclusivity, and museum activism, deepening students' understanding of Indian modern art and its societal context. In collaboration with other departments and organizations, the department hosted a talk: “From Draft to Publication: Elevate Your Research Paper for Impact and Success” on 4th September by Prof. Rajesh, Nodal Officer, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan. The session focused on elevating research papers for impactful academic publication, with practical guidance on advancing preliminary drafts to finished manuscripts. On 25 September, the department organized a talk on "Drug Abuse and Its Social Consequences" by Dr. Bharat Bhushan. The discussion highlighted the multifaceted nature of addiction, with insights from recovered addict Mr. Vikas and Project Director Ms. Malika, who emphasized life skills for prevention. Dr. Bhushan proposed actionable steps for the college to address drug abuse, including awareness programs and supportive environments. Finally, on 13 November, the department hosted an Inter-college Undergraduate Research Seminar on "Digital India: Potentialities, Opportunities and Concerns." The seminar featured 16 presentations selected from over 50 abstracts. Topics included AI, social media interactions, and digital politics. Salma Mehar (Lady Shri Ram College) won the first prize, while students from Indraprastha College and other institutions secured additional awards. The event concluded with engaging discussions, aiding budding researchers in refining their work. These initiatives underscored the department's commitment to fostering academic excellence, critical inquiry, and meaningful societal engagement.

## **B. A. PROGRAM**

The B.A. Program Department at Indraprastha College for Women, University of Delhi, hosted an array of vibrant activities in 2024 that highlighted its commitment to academic excellence and community engagement. An Inter-College Poster Making Competition on 8 April, themed “A Step Towards Gender Justice,” saw enthusiastic participation from 20 students and was guided by Dr. Akham Hemabati and Priyanka Danu, with esteemed judges Dr. Rajan Maurya and Dr. Disha Pokhrajal. On 9 April, Dr. Hariom Gandhi, DIG of CISF, conducted an engaging session on drug awareness, emphasizing informed choices and the importance of creating a supportive, drug-free campus under the "Happy Campus" initiative. The same day, the Annual Departmental Fest EKTA 2024 celebrated the centennial of IPCW with the theme "Happiness in Life; Celebrating Centennial," featuring a fashion show tracing IPCW’s history through decades and cultural performances that celebrated India’s diversity. Earlier, on 18 March, the department organized an Inter-College Essay Writing Competition on "Viksit Bharat: Women Empowerment," which attracted over 200 participants from leading colleges. The department bid a heartfelt farewell to its graduating seniors on 2 May with memorable activities, including a fashion walk, photo parades, and junior performances that evoked nostalgia and joy. Freshers of 2024 were welcomed on 25 October with a Bollywood-themed ramp walk competition, lively performances, and engaging activities, fostering camaraderie among students. These initiatives reflect the department’s holistic approach to education, combining intellectual pursuits with cultural and social enrichment.

## NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

The National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit, under the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India, organizes diverse annual events every year. This year, the NSS Unit of Indraprastha College for Women hosted myriad events. The first and foremost event was a poster-making competition on the inauguration of the 27th National Youth Festival, conducted on 12 January 2024, which had a large turnout of 42 participants. In this event, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi praised the youth for their achievements and urged them to lead the nation's transformation by 2047. A face-painting competition on Basant Panchami in February was also organized, wherein around 45 students took part.

A 'Water Conservation' drive was held under Project Amrit on 22 February 2024, with 150 students participating. This was a significant step towards water conservation. An online quiz and awareness march were conducted in March, followed by the flagship event of the NSS, entitled Kartavya'24, in April. Kartavya'24 included a cleanliness drive, movie screening, and "Yemaya" – a women-centric startup initiative, with 70 students actively participating. On 1 and 2 May, a free dental check-up camp was organized in collaboration with House of Clove and Whistle and Smile, benefiting over 250 participants with expert dental care and oral hygiene kits.

A plantation drive marked the celebration of World Environment Day on 5 June. From 14 to 18 June 2024, a slogan writing activity was held to mark Blood Donors Day, with 33 students actively participating. This event aimed to raise awareness and inspire contributions to this vital cause. To commemorate the 10 International Yoga Day on 21 June, a yoga session guided by Dr. Divyansh Jain encouraged 50 participants to practice asanas, breathing techniques, and meditation, aligning with the theme 'Yoga for Self and Society.' A virtual "Yoga with Family" activity also nurtured physical and emotional well-being.

In celebration of India's 78th Independence Day, the Har Ghar Tiranga campaign was conducted from 9 to 15 August 2024, with volunteers hoisting the national tricolor at home and sharing their patriotic moments through selfies and reels. This campaign fostered a strong sense of national pride and unity. Additionally, on 14 August 2024, NSS volunteers participated in the 'Vibhajan Vibhishika Smriti Diwas' at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi. The event honored the struggles of partition survivors and featured a documentary screening, organized in collaboration with the Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts, portraying the pain and resilience of those displaced. Thirty-seven volunteers attended this event, finding the experience deeply impactful.

On 27 September 2024, the NSS signed an MoU with the Delhi State AIDS Control Society to establish a Red Ribbon Club, focusing on AIDS awareness and combating stigma. Around 104 students participated. A sensitization talk on health and nutrition under Mission Saksham Anganwadi and Poshan 2.0 highlighted community welfare on 26 September 2024, with 86 participants. Another flagship event, Swachhata Pakhwada, was organized under the theme "Swabhav Swachhta - Sanskar Swachhta," with 140 participants in cleanliness drives and rallies held from 17 September to 1 October 2024.

The NSS Day on 24 September 2024 was celebrated with events like face painting, open mic sessions, and a speaker session, with 150 students participating. The Chief Guest for the event was Shri Sharwan Ram Ji, Regional Director of NSS Delhi, and Dr. Narender Bishnoi, Program Coordinator of the University of Delhi, graced the occasion.

To commemorate Gandhi Jayanti on 2 October, the NSS Unit organized Swachh Bharat Diwas at Chauhan Park, Dhaka Village, Mukherjee Nagar. Sixty-two volunteers, including 13 NSS volunteers, participated, showcasing their dedication to community welfare. The drive involved cleaning a park and collecting approximately 7-10 garbage bags of waste, which were later forwarded to the MCD garbage collector.

The volunteers also joined the International Balika Diwas on 11 October. These initiatives highlight the NSS Unit's dedication to promoting societal awareness, national pride, and individual well-being of girls within and outside the college community. The unit participated in the Deepotsav event on 13 November 2024, graced by Hon'ble Lt. Governor of Delhi, Shri Vinai Kumar Saxena. The event, held at Basudev Ghat, Civil Lines, New Delhi, celebrated Dev Deepawali, Guru Parv, and the 150th birth anniversary of Lord Birsa Munda, with 47 volunteers participating.

On National Unity Day, an online poster-making competition commemorated Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel's legacy. A Padayatra on 25 November 2024, under the theme "Mera Samvidhan, Mera Swabhiman," was organized by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, with 21 participants from the NSS Unit. A preamble reading and quiz were held on 26 November 2024 to celebrate Constitution Day, in collaboration with the Erudite Quiz Society, with 76 attendees. This thoughtful initiative allowed students to understand the depth and importance of the Constitution.

Special camps are organized annually for NSS volunteers and members. The National Integration Camp (NIC) promotes harmony and togetherness among people from various cultural and geographic origins. A National Integration Camp was held at Guru Jambheshwar University of Science and Technology from 11 to 17 October, and another at BRCM Law College, Bhiwani, Haryana, from 6 to 12 November 2024. The NSS Pre-Republic Day Parade Camp 2024 was held at Vivekananda Global University, Jaipur, Rajasthan, attended by selected volunteers. Additionally, the NSS Unit witnessed the participation of the program officer as a contingent leader and one volunteer in the National Adventure Camp at Atal Bihari Vajpayee Institute of Mountaineering and Allied Sports, Manali, from 10 to 19 November.

On 12 December, a Familiarization Exercise (FAMEX) program was organized in collaboration with the 16 Battalion NDRF and District Disaster Management Authority, Delhi.

Under the leadership of Principal Prof. Poonam Kumria, the NSS Unit of Indraprastha College for Women, Delhi University, successfully organized impactful events this year, championing various causes and striving to continue this legacy in the future.

# NATIONAL CADET CORPS

The NCC wing of Indraprastha College for Women has witnessed a remarkable resurgence, marked by its re-establishment and an unwavering commitment to discipline, leadership, and service. This journey began with the revival of the NCC spirit on campus, uniting cadets under a shared goal of excellence. Over the past year, cadets have demonstrated exceptional dedication, actively participating in training, competitions, and community service, thereby strengthening the legacy of the National Cadet Corps within the college.

The revival of the NCC wing was formally recognized on 30 September 2023, with the inauguration of a dedicated NCC room by the Additional Director General (ADG). This was followed by a visit from the Commanding Officer and the team of the 7 Delhi Girls Battalion on 17 October 2023, who attended the NCC Orientation Program. The event proved to be a turning point, further motivating cadets and reaffirming their commitment to the organization. The 75th Republic Day celebrations in 2024 provided another momentous occasion, where cadets had the honor of presenting the Guard of Honour to the national flag. In recognition of her outstanding contributions, SUO Vedika Singh was awarded the Best All-Rounder Award at the college's centenary celebrations, presented by the Honourable Vice President of India.

Beyond institutional events, the NCC wing made its mark in inter-college NCC fests across Delhi University. Within just two months, cadets secured over 20 trophies in various competitions, including cultural and sports events, debates, quizzes, and extempore. These accomplishments highlighted their teamwork, dedication, and leadership, distinguishing them from their peers. The cadets also excelled in national-level camps, with SUO Vedika Singh securing third place in the 10M Air Pistol Shooting event at the All-India Inter-Directorate Sports Shooting Championship (IDSSC) 2024. Additionally, cadets participated in the Army Attachment Camp with the prestigious 18 Grenadiers Regiment, where they gained firsthand experience in military training and discipline.

At the Combined Annual Training Camp (CATC) 2024, IPCW cadets achieved significant success. Cadet Tanu Bisla won first place in extempore and was a runner-up in the poetry competition, while SUO Vedika Singh was appointed Company Senior and recognized as the Best Firer. Other notable achievements included awards for exceptional anchoring, social media contributions, and overall excellence. Moreover, three cadets were selected to attend the National Camp, Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat (EBSB) - Delhi 2024, further expanding their exposure to NCC activities at the national level.

The enthusiasm for NCC continued to grow, with over 300 students expressing interest in joining. A rigorous selection process, including physical and written assessments, resulted in the enrollment of 60 new cadets for the prestigious three-year NCC training program. The NCC wing also received the ADG Commendation Award at the Directorate level for excellence in a reel-making competition.

As the year concluded, the NCC wing of Indraprastha College for Women stood as a beacon of dedication, excellence, and service. With unwavering commitment, the cadets continue to uphold the values of the NCC, setting new benchmarks for future generations.

# CAREER COUNSELING AND PLACEMENT COMMITTEE

Aiming to provide insights into industry trends, career prospects, and growth opportunities within KPMG India, KPMG India Learning Services conducted a seminar on Accounting and Auditing for Commerce and Economics students on 9 February 2024. The event featured presentations from distinguished speakers Mr. Sahil Nayar, Mr. Arun Babbar, and Ms. Zoya Hossain, who shared valuable insights into career and growth opportunities in the accounting and auditing sectors at KPMG. They also addressed student queries, making the session highly interactive and enriching for attendees.

In an effort to help students navigate the process of applying to international universities, ICAE hosted a workshop followed by a university fair on 7 March 2024, led by Ms. Anne. The workshop provided crucial information about what universities look for in applicants, including academics, standardized tests, extracurricular involvement, and application deadlines for different countries. Beyond academics, the session offered advice on financial planning, adapting to a new culture, and visa procedures. Following the workshop, students had the opportunity to connect with representatives from various universities, enabling them to ask further questions and explore their options.

The Global University Fair 2024 was held on 7 March 2024, in collaboration with ICAE India. The college hosted several universities and institutions, including SI-UK, United States-India Educational Foundation, Ashoka University, Dublin Technological University, and Singapore University of Management. The fair witnessed over 500 student registrations, with attendees from diverse courses benefiting from one-on-one interactions with university representatives. These interactions helped students clarify doubts about admission and preparation procedures, making the event an enriching experience for both the host team and the participating universities.

On 24 April 2024, the Career Counselling and Placement Committee and the Department of Political Science at Indraprastha College for Women, University of Delhi, hosted an Alumna Talk featuring IAS Pari Bishnoi, Additional District Magistrate of District Gyalshing, Sikkim. With an All India Rank of 30 in the UPSC CSE 2019, she shared her insights on maximizing college life and the realities of public service.

The two-day placement preparation bootcamp on 22 & 23 August 2024, commenced with an insightful session by Mr. Gagan Singh, who discussed the art of crafting impactful resumes for job applications. Under the guidance of the convenors, the bootcamp was attended by over 150 students. On the first day, Mr. Singh emphasized customizing resumes to align with specific job descriptions, focusing on including relevant skills and experiences. The second day shifted to building confidence and honing group-discussion skills. Mr. Singh highlighted the importance of making a memorable impression through effective communication, encapsulated in the principles of Content, Communication, and Class. Engaging activities, such as analyzing body language in films, effectively illustrated these principles, making the sessions both interactive and memorable.

Dr. Alison Ashby, Senior Lecturer at the University of Exeter Business School, delivered an insightful talk on 7 November 2024, focusing on the importance of sustainability in businesses. She emphasized the role of technology, data science, and AI in addressing sustainability challenges and highlighted the complexity of incorporating sustainability into supply chain management due to conflicting objectives, such as balancing employee welfare, environmental concerns, fair pricing, and resource management.

## EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL

The Equal Opportunity Cell of Indraprastha College for Women organized Aikyam 2.0 on 23 October 2024, an event celebrating National Unity Day. ## ENABLING UNIT

The Enabling Unit of Indraprastha College supports ‘under one roof’ policy for catering to the needs of PwBD students. The farewell for the graduating batch of 2024 was held on May 3, 2024, in the Enabling Unit building of the college. The event, organized by first and second-year students of the Enabling Unit and Maitri Society, included cultural performances, games, and various activities. A free eye check-up camp and public awareness fortnight program was organized on September 4, 5, and 6, 2024, in collaboration with Saksham Delhi. The event included an eye check-up van, which benefitted 152 participants, including students, staff, and faculty. A total of 10 eyeglasses were distributed, and 19 keyboards were provided to PwBD students to support their computer-based studies. A special lecture by Dr. Noopur Pandey focused on eye-related diseases and preventive measures. An MoU was signed with Saksham Delhi for future collaborations to uplift students with disabilities. The event highlighted the commitment of students, professors, and volunteers under the guidance of Principal Prof. Poonam Kumria and faculty convenors.

A laptop distribution program was held on September 8, 2024, in collaboration with the Help The Blind Foundation. Nine laptops were distributed to PwBD students by the hands of Dr. B. K. The event emphasized inclusivity and encouraged students to participate in activities like the Paralympics.

Students from Indraprastha College for Women attended the Purple Fest at Amrit Udyan on February 26, 2024. Thirteen PwBD students and nine Maitri Society volunteers participated in the event, accompanied by faculty members Ms. Shraddha Upadhyay and Dr. Anuradha Sharma. Activities included Braille-based visual paintings, sensory games, and stage performances by students. The Hon’ble President of India, Shrimati Draupadi Murmu, interacted with the students

and appreciated the college's efforts. The visit was an enriching experience for all participants.

The annual inter-college cultural festival "Samarthya" was organized on January 15, 2024. # ACADEMIA-CULTURAL INDULGENCE

## ANANTA– SCIENCE AND INNOVATION SOCIETY

The Science and Innovation Society of Indraprastha College for Women organized a two-day celebration of National Science Day 2024, centered on the theme “Indigenous Technologies for Viksit Bharat.” The events aimed to inspire and educate students about India’s potential to lead in technological and scientific advancements.

On Day 1, the celebrations commenced with a Discussion Forum in the Conference Room. Participants explored the theme, focusing on how indigenous technologies could propel India toward self-reliance and global leadership. Discussions highlighted India’s achievements, such as INS Vikrant and ISRO’s Mangalyaan and Chandrayaan missions, and emphasized reducing imports to boost economic resilience. Ancient contributions, including Ayurveda and the works of mathematicians like Bhaskaryacharya, were celebrated, with participants urging the youth to rediscover India’s innovative potential during this "Amrit Kaal." The event concluded with acknowledgments to participants, judges, and organizing members, leaving the audience with valuable insights.

The Enigma Encounter Quiz brought together 19 teams from colleges across Delhi University. The Treasure Hunt, inspired by Homer’s *Odyssey*, was a highlight of the day. Teams competed across five challenging stages. The first stage, “Athena’s Deception,” tested teams’ ability to discern true and false statements from “scientists,” earning tokens for correct answers. The second stage, “Flowers for Penelope,” involved identifying flowers, with bonus points for scientific names. In “The Search for Odysseus,” teams solved clues to retrieve letters with hidden messages revealed through heat application. The fourth stage, “Lotus Eaters’ Island,” was a memory-based game of matching cards with scientific names. The final stage, “The Last Battle,” saw teams decode a riddle leading to the squash court, where the treasure was hidden among decoys. The event combined strategy, teamwork, and problem-solving, creating an exhilarating experience for participants.

The Science Carnival featured departmental stalls that blended fun with education. The Geography Department engaged visitors with map puzzles, riddles, and flag identification games, while the

Psychology Department explored memory, optical illusions, and visual differences. The Computer Science Department introduced sorting algorithms and random number games, while Environmental Studies highlighted sustainability through e-waste management, ecological quizzes, and interactive games. The Mathematics Department offered challenges like maze navigation and mental math quizzes. Each stall attracted enthusiastic participation, generating funds and fostering an appreciation for scientific exploration.

On Day 2, the celebrations continued with a formal program inaugurated by Shri Narendra Taneja, a global energy policy expert and Chief Guest for the event. The day began with the ceremonial lamp lighting, the national anthem, and the launch of Ananta's annual magazine. A documentary showcasing scientific achievements captivated the audience, setting an inspiring tone.

Complementing the National Science Day celebrations were impactful workshops. The "Technical Awareness Workshop on Cyber Security" in collaboration with the Indian School of Ethical Hacking (ISOEH) introduced students to ethical hacking, social engineering, and dark web threats. A live demonstration of advanced hacking techniques captivated attendees, highlighting vulnerabilities and the importance of robust security. The "Leveraging Technology in Epidemiology" workshop by Dr. Satyam Sil explored real-time disease surveillance systems like ISDP and IHIP. Participants learned to identify trends through data analysis and were introduced to tools for public health monitoring, reinforcing the importance of cross-sectoral collaboration for societal well-being.

## **SOCIETY OF GREEN ACTION**

Indraprastha College for Women (IPCW), the oldest women's college of the University of Delhi, established in 1924, is a pioneer in sustainability and empowerment. Over 70% of its energy is sourced from solar power, complemented by LED lighting, rainwater harvesting, and waste management initiatives like composting and recycling. The Society of Green Actions promotes environmental consciousness through campaigns like Mission LiFE, anti-littering drives, and partnerships such as an MoU with Green Mentors for green audits and training. IPCW students actively participate in global programs like UNSSC's My Sustainable Lifestyle Challenge and the Nature Positive Universities initiative. Efforts include biodiversity awareness, tree plantation, and

fostering eco-friendly habits, solidifying IPCW's role as a hub for education and environmental stewardship.

The dual crises of climate change and biodiversity loss threaten ecosystems and human livelihoods, demanding urgent, collective action. Recognizing this, Indraprastha College for Women (IPCW), as a nodal center for the Nature Positive Universities (NPU) initiative under the University of Delhi, has taken significant strides toward fostering sustainable practices and biodiversity conservation. As a founding member of NPU, IPCW's commitment is evident through its innovative Principal Internship Program, launched in July 2024, which aims to instill nature-positive behaviors within academic institutions.

The program is structured in three impactful phases: an online awareness campaign, offline engagement through seminars and events, and extensive campus biodiversity campaigns. These phases empower students to lead by example, promoting sustainability in their communities. Activities such as interactive sessions, surveys, and campaigns like "Bring Your Own Cup" encourage the reduction of plastic waste, while waste segregation drives and textbook exchange programs further emphasize the importance of resource conservation.

Key events such as the International Green Boardroom and Aikyam 2024 have been instrumental in amplifying the program's reach. These initiatives engaged over 500 students across various departments, fostering collaboration and driving home the urgency of environmental stewardship. The International Green Boardroom served as a platform for thought leaders and students to exchange ideas on sustainability, while Aikyam 2024 celebrated the spirit of unity in biodiversity conservation.

Through its multifaceted approach, IPCW has successfully mobilized students to adopt environmentally conscious habits and champion the cause of biodiversity. These efforts underscore the critical role of universities as hubs for innovation, advocacy, and change. By integrating sustainability into academic and extracurricular activities, IPCW is not only addressing the immediate challenges of climate change and biodiversity loss but also inspiring a generation to think and act sustainably.

The IPCW-NPU collaboration exemplifies how academic institutions can lead the way in creating a resilient, nature-positive future, setting a benchmark for others to follow in the global fight against environmental degradation.

## **CENTER FOR HIMALAYAN RESEARCH**

The Centre for Himalayan Research (CHR) at Indraprastha College for Women, in collaboration with the Centre for Himalayan Studies, University of Delhi, organized a workshop titled “Himalaya: Guardian of Ecosystems, Cultures, and Communities” on 21st December 2024. This event, an outcome of the MoU signed during the Geo-Fest by IPCW's Kshitij Society, saw participation from 192 students, scholars, and faculty members.

Pandey discussed the impacts of climate change on the Himalayas and advocated blending traditional knowledge with modern techniques like GIS for sustainable development. Prof. V. S. Negi stressed community-driven conservation, showcasing grassroots initiatives for disaster mitigation and biodiversity preservation.

An interactive session addressed sustainable tourism, climate resilience, and youth participation in conservation. The workshop concluded with a vote of thanks, reinforcing the significance of interdisciplinary collaboration to safeguard the Himalayas’ ecosystems, cultures, and communities for a sustainable future.

## **ENTREPRENEURSHIP CELL**

The Entrepreneurship Cell of Indraprastha College for Women demonstrated remarkable progress in fostering innovation and entrepreneurial skills through a series of impactful initiatives conducted from January to December 2024. Guided by Convenor Dr. Bindu Oberoi and Co-Convenor Ms. Sujayata Choudhry, these events underscored the cell’s commitment to empowering young women with the skills and mindset to excel in the entrepreneurial world, leaving a lasting impact on the college community.

## **ENACTUS**

Participants showcased their analytical skills, offering opposing perspectives in a rigorous two-round format. Judges evaluated arguments on clarity, evidence, and delivery. The competition highlighted the transformative power of discourse in advocating for a more equitable media landscape.

## **SIMULACRA**

Simulacra, the Film and Photography Society of Indraprastha College for Women, serves as a vibrant platform for students passionate about cinema and photography. As part of Shruti '24, the college's annual cultural fest held on 18–19 April 2024, Simulacra organized "Tropes '24," featuring the online filmmaking competition "Afsane," where participants created films on assigned themes, and the photo exhibition "Timepiece." These events, complemented by a screening of films made by the society, were a resounding success, owing to the dedication of its members and faculty advisors. Earlier in March, the society, in collaboration with Udaan and the Department of Multimedia and Mass Communication, conducted a three-day filmmaking workshop. Esteemed professionals, including Shri Avtar Sahni and Shri Anoop Trivedi, led sessions on direction, acting, scriptwriting, cinematography, production, and post-production. The workshop, inaugurated by Principal Prof. Poonam Kumaria, featured practical exercises, Q&A sessions, and insights into authentic storytelling, inspiring students to delve deeper into cinema. Later in October, Simulacra hosted a spot photography competition during Spandan '24, for the freshers to showcase their talent with the theme "Your First Impression of IP College." The first, second, and third winners were awarded after reviewing of all entries by external judges. To commemorate Veer Baal Diwas on 26 December, the society held a poster exhibition honoring the martyrdom of Sahibzaade Baba Zorawar Singh Ji and Baba Fateh Singh Ji.

## CROYDON

In 2024, Croydon – The Fine Arts Society at Indraprastha College for Women played a central role in enriching the campus through creativity and cultural engagement. The society’s efforts were showcased during major events such as the Centennial College Day on 7 February, where they created iconic installations like the Mashal Lady and Butterfly selfie stands, symbolizing empowerment and transformation.
